

2025-26 Required Student Assessments and Training

Introduction

The purpose of this document is to summarize expectations for academic student assessments in Iowa schools.

The table below outlines all assessment requirements for districts and nonpublic schools, as mandated by federal law and Iowa code.

Administering assessments for ELI requirements (Iowa Code § 279.68)	Audience: All users of the assessments. Frequency: Prior to initial administration, and recommend updating at least annually.	Assessment specific. For example, the FastBridge system offers training modules in its Training and Resources tab.	Prior to administering the first assessment, all users must complete the required training for the assessment as defined by the assessment vendor. It is strongly recommended that users frequently refresh their administration and scoring knowledge. Some assessments (such as the FastBridge suite of measures) have an assessment certification process.
Early Literacy Alternate Assessment (EL AA)	Audience: All users of the assessment. Frequency: Required every year.	AEA Learning Online	Prior to administering Iowa's Early Literacy Alternate Assessment, teachers are required to take training that reviews the assessment requirements and any changes from the previous administration.
Teaching Strategies GOLD®	Audience: All users of the assessment. Frequency: Required every three (3) years.	In the Develop Area of My Teaching Strategies GOLD website .	It is highly recommended that teaching staff complete the Interrater Reliability Certification (IRC) to support the reliable use of GOLD®. Teaching assistants who have completed the MyTeachingStrategies GOLD® Introduction and Interrater Reliability Certification may complete preliminary leveling, if the lead teacher and administrator agree.
