Executive Director and Bureau Chief's Update

Scholarships and Grant Team

Recognition is in order for our Scholarships and Grants team as we have received tremendous feedback from financial aid directors and those in the field on how well our team has handled the challenges and changes that financial aid professionals have faced this year. While many states are facing significant shortfalls due to inaccurate forecasting and estimating, thanks to our team's work, Iowa is in a position where we are able to offer more aid to Iowans than originally anticipated.

The Health Professional Recruitment Program and Rural Iowa Primary Care Programs have awarded nearly 45 Iowans more than \$4 million to meet healthcare needs in Iowa's communities. The Rural Iowa Primary Care program provides loan repayment incentives to individuals that practice in locations facing critical shortages, awarded \$3.2 million to 17 recipients.

The Health Professional Recruitment Program, which provides for health professionals in communities that agree to a dollar-for-dollar match in loan repayment, distributed more than \$855,000 to 26 awardees that are advanced registered nurse practitioners, athletic trainers, occupational therapists, physical therapists, physicians, physician assistants, podiatrists or registered nurses practicing in a high-need community.

One of our other successful loan repayment programs, the Teach Iowa Scholar Program, is currently accepting applications until Oct. 31.

Additionally, the Iowa National Guard Service Scholarship has been authorized to award 100 percent of the average Regent's university tuition of \$9,034 annually.

GEAR UP Iowa

In early August, GEAR UP Iowa successfully hosted nearly 100 GEAR UP Iowa partners for its annual kick off event at the DMACC Ankeny Campus. Educators and administrators from all 13 GEAR UP Iowa districts participated in sessions to strategize and learn from GEAR UP Iowa staff, experts from the Iowa Department of Education and a slew of educational facilitators to craft a full day of programming, networking and building for a successful 2024-25 school year.

As the school year gets underway, GEAR UP Iowa staff is helping coordinate kickoff events at open houses in GEAR UP Iowa schools throughout the state.

Executive Director and Bureau Chief's Update

Local College Access Networks (LCAN)

Last month we announced our newest round of Local College Access Network (LCAN) grant funding with more than \$370,000 awarded to nine communities in Iowa. Eight of the nine communities funded are returning communities. The newest initiative to receive LCAN funding is Attendance Counts in Northeast Iowa, serving Iowans in Allamakee, Dubuque, Clayton, and Jackson counties. The Community Foundation of Greater Dubuque will serve as the fiscal agent on this grant, which will partner with cross-sector leaders in those counties to address chronic absenteeism and increase high school graduation and postsecondary enrollment and completion rates.

FAFSA

Currently, 52.1 percent of Iowa's class of 2024 has completed the FAFSA, a 2.7 percentage point decrease from the previous year's completion rate. To help erase this gap, we are utilizing a \$276,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Education to fund FAFSA completion initiatives. These funds have helped expand the summer transition associate program and issue subgrants to community colleges and LCANs to bolster FAFSA completion efforts in their communities. Staff has also hosted various FAFSA completion events and established a presence at community events throughout the state to generate FAFSA awareness and encourage FAFSA completion.

 - *Successfully transition all state authorization applications from GovToGo to AccessGov with minimal disruption to institutions of higher education.*
 - *Streamline program evaluation and reporting requirements, including outcomes analysis for all state financial aid programs and annual legislative reports.*
- Community Engagement
 - *Support GEAR UP Iowa schools with administering their federal grant programs and budgets through ongoing communication, statewide*
