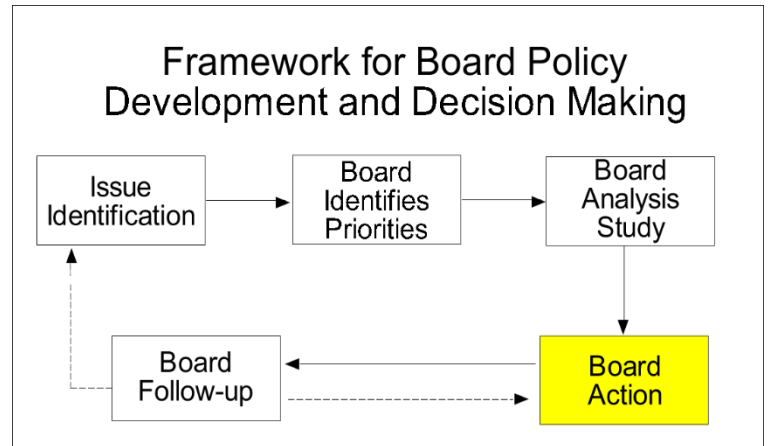

### Adopted and Filed

The State Board of Education hereby amends Chapter 46, “Career and Technical Education,” Iowa Administrative Code.

#### *Legal Authority for Rulemaking*

This rulemaking is adopted under the authority provided in Iowa Code section 256.129(5).

#### *State or Federal Law Implemented*

This rulemaking implements, in whole or in part, Iowa Code section 256.136.

#### *Purpose and Summary*

This rulemaking removes a superfluous reference to federal funds from the rule on regional planning partnerships (RPPs). RPP funds are state dollars, and any use of federal funds to support an RPP’s work would be solely governed by federal law.

#### *Public Comment and Changes to Rulemaking*

Notice of Intended Action for this rulemaking was published in the Iowa Administrative Bulletin on May 14, 2025, as **ARC 9195**.

A public hearing was held on June 3, 2025, at 12:00 at Room B50, Grimes State Office Building, Des Moines, IA. Nobody attended the public hearing. There were no public comments. The rules are identical to the notice of intended action.

#### *Adoption of Rulemaking*

This rulemaking was adopted by the State Board of Education on June 19, 2025.

#### *Fiscal Impact*

This rulemaking has no fiscal impact to the state of Iowa.

#### *Jobs Impact*

After analysis and review of this rulemaking, no impact on jobs has been found.

#### *Waivers*

Any person who believes that the application of the discretionary provisions of this rulemaking would result in hardship or injustice to that person may petition the State Board for a waiver of the discretionary provisions, if any, pursuant to 281—Chapter 4.

#### *Review by Administrative Rules Review Committee*

The Administrative Rules Review Committee, a bipartisan legislative committee which oversees rulemaking by executive branch agencies, may, on its own motion or on written request by any individual or group, review this rulemaking at its regular monthly meeting or at a special meeting. The Committee's meetings are open to the public, and interested persons may be heard as provided in Iowa Code section 17A.8(6).

#### *Effective Date*

This rulemaking will become effective on August 13, 2025.

The following rulemaking action is adopted:

ITEM 1. Amend subrule 46.10(6), introductory paragraph, as follows:

**46.10(6)** *Secondary career and technical education funds.* An approved regional career and technical education partnership may use funds received from state ~~and federal~~ sources on behalf of school districts and community colleges participating in the regional career and technical education planning partnership for the following:
