The bill to modify the definition of 5 grooming was not finalized but may still remain active for the 2026 session. The bill 6 relating to abuse-reporting being overseen by HHS was passed. 7 8 Agency Update: 9 The open Administrative Consultant Position has been advertised and will remain 10 open until May 27, 2025. It can be reposted for an additional 15 days if necessary. 11 12 Financial Report: 13 BoEE income has been reduced over the last two years, mainly due to legislative 14 action. In addition, there have been an increase in expenditures with one new 15 investigator hired in 2024 and indirect costs increase due to our joining the 16 Department of Education. The Board found there was undue hardship. The applicant 5 6 has tried to get a copy of her diploma to satisfy the requirement, but has unable to 7 secure one due to many documents destroyed during a war in the country she went to 8 school in. There is no way for the applicant to remedy this issue. The rule from which 9 Ms. Omerovic seeks a waiver is not specifically mandated by statute or any other 10 provision of law, and, accordingly, may be waived by the Board. The Board also found 11 Ms. Omerovic has taken the necessary classes for the Paraeducator Certificate and she 12 has the support of her employer in granting the waiver.
