Director's Update

Iowa Department of Education Director, Commissioner Snow, will provide department updates.

Executive Director and Bureau Chief's Update

Scholarships and grants

- July 1 was the FAFSA deadline for the majority of the state financial aid program. With that milestone passed for the 2025-26 academic year, staff is evaluating awards and appeals.
- The four previously existing health care loan repayment and income incentive programs recently disbursed funds to recipients. Approximately \$1.5 million was issued to 98 recipients.
- Staff recently received notification of the allocations for the Education and Training Voucher and is in the process of notifying recipients.
- Staff deployed multi-factor authentication to the Iowa College Aid Processing System to add an
 additional safeguard to the personal information contained within the system. This impacts primarily
 institutional financial aid officers that utilize the system and does not affect the general public.

Local College and Career Access Networks

- We recently awarded \$258,000 to five communities in Iowa to fund Local College and Career Access Networks. This round of funding added two new LCANs in Columbus Junction and First to Finish in Des Moines to the statewide network of LCANs. Anne Thomas will be sharing more information later today about the LCAN program.
- Staff helped facilitate the IHEMTAC Summer Conference alongside our Math Pathways LCAN that focuses helping students transition from high school to postsecondary math courses.

GEAR UP Iowa

- GEAR UP Iowa has added two new facilitators to its staff in Isaac Newsome and Amy Smith.
- The entire GEAR UP lowa team attended the national NCCEP GEAR UP conference in San Francisco.
- Staff is preparing for its annual GEAR UP lowa kickoff event August 4 with our GEAR UP lowa partners.

Course to College/FAFSA

- Summer FAFSA reports are being issued to 63 high schools this summer.
- As of July 9, 51 percent of the class of 2024-25 in lowa has completed the FAFSA. This is a two percentage point increase from this time last year.

AmeriCorps

- We will soon be announcing a nearly \$500,000 AmeriCorps grant that will fund our Course to College Corps of student leaders, college coaches and summer transition associates. This grant will fund more than 80 positions across the state to help lowans pursue postsecondary education.
- Our 10 summer transition associates began their work in early June and continue to work in their communities to ensure that students who intend to enroll in postsecondary opportunities do so.

Postsecondary Authorization

- Staff attended the Midwest SARA conference to meet with state authorization officials from the region and discuss future goals for M-SARA.
- Annual invoices were issued to 43 registered schools and 38 SARA members that operate in Iowa.
 Those invoices total \$234,000.
