14	Sammons, Dr. Michael Pyevich. Also in attendance was Mike Cavin, Executive
15	Director, Beth Myers, Attorney/Investigator, Diane Dennis, Lori Lavorato, William
16	Rector and Matthew Barron, Investigators, and Lindsey Browning, Assistant Attorney
17	General. Pam Bleam, Miranda Brus and Dr. Davis Eidahl were unable to attend.

- 25 <u>Petition for Waiver</u>
- Daniel Zylstra moved, with a second by Jennifer Sammons that the board grant PFW
- 27 25-03, Nicole Dinville. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.** Reason for granting: On
- 28 May 16, 2025 the Board received a Petition from Dinville requesting a waiver of the
- 29 rules for the Pk-K endorsement. Ms. Dinville is not able to add the Pk-K endorsement
- 30 because she does not have a K-6 Classroom Teacher or K-8 Special Education
- endorsement. Ms. Dinville does hold an Iowa Teaching license with a K-8 Reading, K-

The rule from which Ms. Dinville seeks a waiver is 3 4 not specifically mandated by statute or any other provision of law, and, accordingly, 5 may be waived by the Board. The Pk-K teaching area is considered a difficult-to-fill 6 area in the district she works in and she is hoping to fill one of those positions. 7 8 Davis Eidahl moved, with a second by Daniel Zylstra that the board grant PFW 25-04, Amela Jasarevic. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. Reason for granting: On May 9 10 29, 2025 the Board received a Petition from Ms. Jasarevic requesting a waiver of the rules to add an endorsement. Jasarevic is seeking a waiver of the requirement for a 11 12 high school diploma. Current rules require applicants possess a minimum of a high school diploma or graduate equivalent diploma. Ms. Jasarevic was raised and 13 14 completed high school in Bosnia. Verification of her diploma was destroyed due to war. 15 She has attempted to obtain a copy, but has been unsuccessful. Ms. Jasarevic seeks a 16 Paraeducator Certificate. The Board found there was undue hardship; the applicant 17 has tried to get a copy of her diploma to satisfy the requirement, but has been unable 18 to secure one due to many documents destroyed during a war in the country she went 19 to school in. There is no way for the applicant to remedy this issue. The rule from 20 which Ms. Jasarevic seeks a waiver is not specifically mandated by statute or any other provision of law, and, accordingly, may be waived by the Board. Ms. Jasarevic 21 22 has taken the necessary classes for the Paraeducator Certificate and she has the 23 support of her employer in granting the waiver. 24 25 Eric St Clair moved, with a second by Mike Pyevich that the board deny PFW 25-05, 26 Lourdez Valadez. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. Reason for denying: On June 27 4, 2025 the Board received a Petition from Ms. Valadez requesting a waiver of the rules for the Paraeducator Preparation program. Ms. Valadez completed a BA preparation in 28 29 Foundation of Education (a non-license education track) through Waldorf College. 30 Waldorf College does not have the Paraeducator Preparation program.
