Community colleges have an "open door" policy, which means that nearly everyone who applies may be accepted.

Each of the 15 community colleges offers comprehensive programs including arts and sciences, college transfer (parallel) courses, career and technical education programs, training and retraining programs for the workforce of Iowa's businesses and industries, and a variety of adult education and non-credit courses for residents of each community college district.

History of Iowa's Community Colleges

Mason City schools established the first two-year postsecondary educational institution in Iowa in 1918. At the time this junior college was organized, there was no law authorizing two-year postsecondary educational programs. Mason City Junior College proved to be successful and was accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools in 1919.

Additional public junior colleges were organized beginning in 1920, and the movement spread rapidly, until, by 1930, at least 32 towns and cities in Iowa had organized public junior colleges as part of their public school systems.

In 1927, the 42nd General Assembly passed the first law authorizing the establishment of public junior colleges. The law permitted the establishment of schools offering instructional programs at a level higher than an approved four-year high school course. The colleges had to be dually authorized by the voters and approved by the State Superintendent of the Iowa Department of Public Instruction (now the Director of the Iowa Department of Education). Such colleges were able to include postsecondary courses of one or two years. The Superintendent was authorized to prepare standards and to provide adequate inspection of these junior colleges.

The Iowa public junior college movement reached its crest in 1927 when nine public junior colleges were

organized. After the year 1930, no public junior colleges were organized until 1946, when Clinton Junior College was founded. In 1931, the 44th General Assembly approved the first restriction to the development of public junior colleges, prohibiting the establishment of a public junior college in any school district having a population of less than 20,000. The 49th General Assembly in 1941 reduced the population requirement to 5,000.

Between the years 1918 and 1953, a total of 35 different public junior colleges were established through the operation of public school districts. Some of these colleges closed, although 10 of the closed colleges later reopened. The enrollment trend steadily increased over the years with the exception of the World War II years. During the 1955-66 decade, which immediately preceded the initiation of a community college system, enrollment almost quadrupled. By 1965, 16 public junior colleges were operating in Iowa and the total enrollment during the fall semester of the 1965-66 school year was 9,110. Local public school districts operated colleges; a dean who reported directly to the local superintendent administered each. These institutions offered arts and sciences programs equivalent to the first two years of the baccalaureate program and a limited number of occupational programs and adult education opportunities.

In 1958, Congress initiated a development parallel to the public junior college movement. Title VIII of the National Defense Education Act (NDEA) made federal funds available to states on a matching basis to develop area vocational programs. To implement this legislation, the Iowa State Board of Education modified the state vocational education plan to make local school districts and Iowa State University eligible to operate as "area schools." This legislation included a specific allocation of funds to develop area vocational programs under NDEA's Title VIII, a designation of area vocationaltechnical high schools, and the authorization for tuitionpaying students to attend these schools and programs.

The Iowa State Board of Education eventually designated a total of 15 schools as area vocational-technical high schools. These schools were also designated as area schools for the purposes of Title VIII, and were to be used to initiate programming for the Manpower Development and Training Act. A total of 1,816 full-time day students enrolled in postsecondary vocational programs for the 1965-66 school year; the majority entered programs administered by agencies operating the area vocational-technical high schools or programs.

Even though public junior colleges and area vocational-technical high schools offered some opportunities for arts and sciences and preparatory vocational education, enrollment opportunities were limited for most Iowans. In 1959, the 58th General Assembly appropriated \$25,000 to the Iowa Legislative Research Bureau to conduct a policy study of the needs of higher education in Iowa. Included in this report was a recommendation to establish regional community colleges. The report also recommended the state pay at least half the cost of building and operating these colleges. As a result of this study, the General Assembly directed the Iowa Department of Public Instruction to conduct a two-year study of the need to develop a statewide system of public community colleges.

The Iowa Department of Public Instruction submitted its report, "Education Beyond High School Age: The Community College," to the General Assembly in December 1962. The report made recommendations and proposed enabling legislation. It recommended restructuring the county educational system and forming 16 area education districts whose boundaries should be drawn along existing school district lines. These districts were intended to replace the county boards of education and provide programs and services that would complement those provided by local school districts. It was envisioned that the area districts would also serve as a legal structure through which a statewide system of community colleges could be developed.

In 1963, the 60th General Assembly took no action on the report. An interim legislative committee concluded that it would be appropriate to put vocational and two-year college education together in a single comprehensive system, but separated the county board consolidation issue (area education agencies were later established by the legislature in 1974). Staff of the Iowa Department of Public Instruction worked closely with various groups throughout the state, and arrived at conclusions similar to those of the interim committee. Passage of the Vocational Education Act of 1963 provided additional impetus to this planning.

After receiving the interim committee's report in 1964, the 61st General Assembly in 1965 enacted legislation that permitted the development of a

statewide system of two-year postsecondary educational institutions, identified as "merged area schools." The Iowa Department of Public Instruction was to direct the operation of the development of merged area schools as either area community colleges or area vocational schools.

Legislation authorizing merged area schools, which are now referred to as "community colleges," provided for fiscal support for these institutions through a combination of student tuition and federal, state, and local funds. These resources included a local three-quarter mill levy on the property within the merged area for operational purposes, and an additional three-quarter mill levy for the purchase of sites and construction of buildings. State general aid was distributed to community colleges on the basis of \$2.25 per day for the average daily enrollment of full-time equivalent students who were residents of Iowa. The 63rd General Assembly changed this formula in 1969 to determine enrollment and state aid on the basis of actual contact hours of instruction. Individual colleges were granted authority to establish tuition rates, except that tuition was not to exceed the lowest tuition rate charged by any one of Iowa's three public universities.

Legislation approved in 1965 was enthusiastically received. The Iowa Department of Public Instruction received the first plan for a community college on July 5, 1965; one day after the legislation was effective. Plans for the other community colleges followed in quick succession. Although the original plans called for 20 areas, the number was quickly reduced to 16 and later one area was split among adjacent areas. Fourteen (14) community colleges were approved and organized in 1966, and a 15th in January 1967. Fourteen (14) of these community colleges began operation during the 1966-67 school year.

Seven (7) districts were originally approved as Area Community Colleges: (current names)

North Iowa Area Community College Iowa Lakes Community College Iowa Central Community College Iowa Valley Community College District Eastern Iowa Community College Des Moines Area Community College Southeastern Community College

Eight (8) were approved as Area Vocational Schools: (current names)

Northeast Iowa Community College Northwest Iowa Community College Hawkeye Community College Kirkwood Community College Western Iowa Tech Community College Iowa Western Community College Southwestern Community College Indian Hills Community College

By July 1970, all of the area vocational-technical high schools and junior colleges had either merged into the new system or were discontinued. All areas of the state were included in community college service areas by July 1971.

The community colleges and area vocational schools grew quickly, both in terms of students served and services offered. In 1983, the Iowa Industrial New Jobs Training Act was established by the legislature adding contracted customized job training to the community colleges' list of services. Other job training programs followed, further expanding the role of community colleges in economic development. Currently, all 15 operate as comprehensive community colleges, offering arts and science (college transfer), vocational preparatory, and adult and continuing education programs. In 1987, Hawkeye Community College, the final Iowa college operating as a vocational school, received approval to operate as a comprehensive community college.

In 1989, the 73rd General Assembly passed Senate File 449, requiring that secondary vocational programs be competency-based, and that the competencies be articulated with postsecondary vocational education. This resulted in increased cooperation between local education agencies and the community colleges and a growth in programs in which high school students are awarded college credit for coursework completed in these articulated programs. The Postsecondary Enrollment Options Act of 1989 and later supplemental weighting allowed high school students to jointly enroll in college credit courses in significantly greater numbers.

In the late 1990s, the majority of community colleges expanded their role in workforce development by becoming Workforce Investment Act primary service providers and housing one-stop centers.

In 1999, the 78th General Assembly passed House File 680 mandating the Department of Education convene a committee to identify and study options for restructuring the governance of Iowa's community colleges. The committee's final report, which was submitted to the legislature in December 1999, reaffirmed the existing governance structure of Iowa's community colleges, with locally elected boards of directors and the State Board of Education with responsibility for statewide oversight and coordination. The study recommended the development of a statewide strategic plan for the system of community colleges.

House File 2433 mandates the development of a statewide strategic plan for the statewide system of community colleges every five years. The first plan was approved by the Iowa Association of Community College Presidents, the Iowa Association of Community College Trustees, and the State Board of Education, and forwarded to the legislature by July 2001. Specific goals included:

- 1. Provide high quality, comprehensive educational programs and services accessible to all Iowans.
- Develop high-skilled workers to meet the demands of Iowa's changing economy.
- Maximize financial and human resources to assure provision of comprehensive community college services to Iowans and to allow Iowa to compete on a national and international level.
- Demonstrate effectiveness and efficiency achieving the system mission and goals.

In January 2003, the State Board of Education amended the Community College Strategic Plan to include a fifth goal:

Recruit, enroll, retain, and/or graduate persons of underrepresented groups (i.e., gender, race/ethnicity, socioeconomic status) in all programs.

Within six months of implementing House File 2433, a progress report was published summarizing statewide and local community college responses to the five-year plan, "Shaping the Future." Annual progress reports are compiled by the Iowa Department of Education and presented to the State Board of Education. In spring 2006, the State Board of Education approved the second five-year statewide community college strategic plan. The following August, the State Board of Education approved performance measures for the plan. Baseline data on each of the measures was reviewed. An annual report is provided to the State Board of Education on these performance measures.

Iowa Code

The statement of policy describing the educational opportunities and services to be provided by community colleges is included in Section 260C.1 of the Iowa Code. This statement of policy identifies the following as services that should be included in a community college's mission.

- The first two years of college work, including preprofessional education.
- Vocational and technical training.
- Programs for in-service training and retraining of workers.
- Programs for high school completion for students of post-high school age.
- Programs for all students of high school age who may best serve themselves by enrolling in vocational and technical training, while also enrolled in a local high school, public or private.

- Programs for students of high school age that provide advanced college placement courses not taught at a student's high school while the student is also enrolled in the high school.
- Student personnel services.
- Community services.
- Vocational education for persons who have academic, socioeconomic, or other handicaps that prevent succeeding in regular vocational education programs.
- Training, retraining, and all necessary preparation for productive employment of all citizens.

- Vocational and technical training for persons who are not enrolled in a high school and who have not completed high school.
- Developmental education for persons who are academically or personally underprepared to succeed in their program of study.



FALL ENROLLMENT

Each fall, the Iowa Department of Education collects enrollment data from Iowa's community colleges on the tenth business day of the semester. The fall data pertain to the 2012-13 academic year (fiscal year 2013). This report is the only report on fiscal year 2013 until next year's *Annual Condition of Iowa's Community Colleges*.

Fall enrollment for 2012 was 100,519 students, a 5.2 percent decline from fall 2011. Since 2008, community college enrollment has grown rapidly, likely a result of the recession of 2008 and 2009. Table 2-1 displays enrollment figures for the latest five years. Tables 2-2 through 2-6 display full- and part-time enrollment figures for each year of the latest five years.


Enrollment fell at 12 of the 15 community colleges. More students were enrolled part-time (less than 12 semester credit hours) than were enrolled full-time. Students enrolled part-time accounted for 53.9 percent of total fall enrollment, compared to 51.8 percent last fall. The fall enrollment of full-time students fell from 51,107 (48.2 percent of total enrollment) to 46,354 (46.1

Collected on the 10th business day of the academic current year. Fall 2012 is a part of fiscal year 2013.





percent of total enrollment), a 9.3 percent decline, while the fall enrollment of part-time students dropped slightly (-1.3 percent) from 54,868 students in 2011 to 54,165 students in 2012.

Enrollment data since 1965 are graphed in Figure 2-1. Although overall fall enrollment has increased more than tenfold since 1965, the number of full-time students as a percentage of total fall enrollment has steadily declined from 90.8 percent in 1965 to 46.1 percent in 2012.

Credit Hours

Each credit hour represents at least 800 minutes of scheduled work for a classroom course; at least 1,600 minutes for a laboratory course; at least 2,400 minutes for clinical work; or at least 3,200 minutes of work experience. Typically, classes at community colleges vary between three and six credit hours. A full-time student must take at least 12 credit hours per semester, which corresponds to 9,600 classroom minutes per

Figure 2-2 depicts total enrolled credit hours since fall 2008. During fall 2012, students enrolled in 938,456 credit hours, a decline of 6.7 percent from fall 2011. The increase in the number of part-time students suggests students who attended community colleges in the fall of 2012 were enrolled in fewer hours.

Students were enrolled in an average of 9.34 credit hours during fall 2012, a slight decrease from fall 2011. The course load among full-time students, however, remained unchanged from fall 2011, averaging 13.72 credit hours. Table 2-7 lists average fall credit hours by community college for the latest five years.

Program Type

Community colleges offer several broad categories of programs:

- College parallel;
- Career and technical education (CTE); and
- College parallel/career option.

College parallel programs prepare students for matriculation to a four-year university, and comprise the largest category of enrollment. The number of students enrolled in this category declined 3.3 percent, from 67,950 students in 2011 to 65,764 students in 2012. Despite this decline, college parallel programs accounted for almost two-thirds (65.4 percent) of total fall 2012 enrollment.

CTE programs prepare students for the workforce. CTE programs accounted for nearly three-tenths (29.9 percent) of fall enrollment. In 2012, fall enrollment for CTE programs was 30,135 students, a 7.43 percent decline from the fall 2011 enrollment of 32,553 students.

College parallel/career option programs prepare students for matriculation to a four-year university or entry into a career field. These programs accounted for 4.5 percent of total fall enrollment. In fall 2012, 4,547 students enrolled in career option programs compared to 5,439 students in 2011, representing a 16.4 percent decrease. Tables 2-8 through 2-12 display fall credit enrollment by program type for each community college during each of the latest five years.

Career ClustersTM

The Iowa Department of Education categorizes CTE programs into 16 career clusters, following the National Career ClustersTM Framework. Each major aligns to a career cluster with other similar programs. Information on Career ClustersTM can be obtained from www. careerclusters.org.

Enrollment in CTE programs can be divided into specific areas of study. Health science remains the largest career cluster within community colleges (12,846), followed by business management and administration (4,440), and then manufacturing (2,616).

Health science enrollment fell 6.1 percent from 13,685 students in fall 2011 to 12,846 students in fall 2012. Business management and administration also fell 11.9 percent during the same time period, from 5,043 students in fall 2011 to 4,440 in fall 2012. Fall enrollment in the manufacturing career cluster, on the other hand, increased 2.8 percent from 2,546 students in 2011 to 2,616 students in 2012.

Student Demographics

Females made up 55.4 percent of students who enrolled in the fall, which is consistent with state and national trends in community colleges and four-year colleges. The average age of all students was 22.96 years (standard deviation = 8.96), and the median age was 21 years.

A traditional student is defined as one who matriculates to postsecondary education in the fall immediately following graduation from high school. Among students attending Iowa community colleges, 23.3 percent met this definition.

There is also a higher percentage of minorities in community colleges than in the state population; a trait common among community colleges. Data from the 2010 decennial census (U.S. Census Bureau, 2011) indicate 11.6 percent of Iowans identified themselves as minorities. For fall 2012, 15.2 percent of community college students identified themselves as minorities, a figure relatively unchanged from fall 2011.

The median is the middle value of an ordered list of numbers.

Black students were the second largest racial/ethnic group (6.6 percent), followed by Hispanics (5.6 percent), and Asian/Pacific Islanders (2.2 percent).

An overwhelming majority of students (91.4 percent) were residents of Iowa, a common trend since the department started collecting data in 1998. Domestic out-of-state residents accounted for 7.7 percent of enrolled students, with foreign students (0.9 percent) accounting for the balance.

Developmental Education of Immediate Enrollees

Students who graduated from an Iowa high school in spring 2012 and enrolled in an Iowa community college in fall 2012 qualify as *immediate enrollees*.

There were 32,577 graduates from Iowa high schools during Spring 2012. The Iowa Department of Education (2012) noted that 8,563 of these high school graduates (26.3 percent) enrolled in a community college the following fall.

Of those immediate enrollees, 2,891 students (33.8



percent) were enrolled in a developmental education course. These students enrolled in 13,208 credit hours in developmental education, 11.5 percent of the total credit hours taken by immediate enrollees.

Similar to all students in developmental education, most of immediate enrollees enrolled in developmental mathematics (2,317 courses) and English (1,699 courses). Smaller developmental course groups were represented by Biology (42 courses), English as Second Language (36 courses) and Computer Applications (12 courses).

Figure 2-3 shows the number of students enrolled in developmental education by department. For the purposes of this section, developmental education is defined as course numbers under 100 (e.g., MAT 050) that cannot be taken to make immediate progress toward completion


of a major. Thus, this data reflects developmental and non-developmental courses for students in each major, since developmental is dependent on major.

Enrollment Projections

An autoregressive integrated moving average (ARIMA) containing fall enrollment data from 2006-2012 was used to estimate fall enrollment for 2013. Based upon enrollment history, the ARIMA model predicts an estimated fall enrollment for 2013 of 97,158 students.

The anomalous spikes in enrollment in 2009 and 2010 have been attributed to economic downturns. Since then, the economy has made modest improvements. Students who had matriculated during this period have, most likely, either completed their courses of study or have withdrawn from college. A declining supply of instate high school graduates has been unable to sustain previous enrollment numbers.

FISCAL YEAR CREDIT ENROLLMENT AND DEMOGRAPHICS

Fiscal year credit enrollment follows students through the 2011-2012 academic year. Courses are counted each time a student takes a course. Headcount will only count a student once. While enrollment dropped, the composition of community college students remained relatively the same.

Student enrollment decreased in 2012 to 152,469 students, which was a 1.7 percent enrollment decline since the prior year. This enrollment decline is the first in the history of the fiscal year enrollment reporting, which started in 1999. Between 2008 and 2012, enrollment grew an average of 4.4 percent each year (Figure 3-1).

Credit hours have also declined for the first time since 1999 at an even greater rate this past year to 2,204,306 hours, a 4.8 percent decrease since the prior year. This decrease in credit hours demonstrates a smaller number of courses taken by a student this year. Over the entire fiscal year 2012, students enrolled in an average of 14.5 credit hours (Figure 3-2).


Enrollment grew moderately for arts and sciences programs. These programs, which are designed to transfer to four-year colleges and universities, grew to 102,148 students—67 percent of overall enrollment (Figure 3-3). Career and technical education (CTE) programs decreased their enrollment by 1,278 students,

to the total of 38,894 students. The moderate growth in arts and sciences parallels an insignificant increase in joint enrollment (Section 5), where students usually major in arts and sciences programs.

Health science remained the largest CTE program, followed by business management and administration, and then manufacturing (Figure 3-7). Enrollment in health science decreased over seven percent to 18,833 students. Business management and administration enrolled 7,067 students, which was seven percent less than last year. Manufacturing, which is both the largest industry in Iowa and hardest hit by the 2008-09 recession,

declined eight percent in 2012, after an increase of close to four percent in fiscal year 2011. Students enrolled in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) programs comprised only 0.3 percent of all enrollees in 2012, a 44 percent decline from Fiscal Year 2011.

The Iowa Department of Education reorganized career clusters to align with the most recent recommendations. Some of the enrollment changes were attributable to the reorganization instead of actual growth. For instance, the significant increase in human services majors and the substantial decline in government and public administration majors were attributable to the career cluster reorganization.

Student Demographics



The typical community college student, as with prior years, is female, under 25, and white. However, the face of the typical student is slightly changing. Although predominately white, more minorities are enrolling into community colleges: with the exception of the FY 2012, when the number of minorities slightly declined, it was steadily growing for the past five years, with average annual growth of 14.7 percent.

On average, a community college student is slightly older than a university student. According to the most recent National Center for Educational Statistics data, the average age of a US college student was 23 years old, while the average age of an Iowa community college

student was 24 years old. The average community college student is also older than a typical student at a four-year university in Iowa. For instance, the average age for undergraduate students attending a public university was slightly over 21 years-old (Iowa State Board of Regents, 2011).

Compared to four-year universities, Iowa community colleges serve an older population; however, most Figure 3-3: Enrollment by Program Type





students are of traditional age: 67 percent were under 25 years-old. The median student age was 21 years-old, which means half of the student population were under that age. (Figure 3-5).

Females continue to outnumber males in community colleges, 56 to 44 percent, respectively (Figure 3-4). Since the community college MIS was established, females have composed most of community college enrollment, remaining steady between 55 and 57 percent. The trend in Iowa's community colleges differs from other levels of education. Males traditionally compose a majority of enrollment at the University of Iowa, University of Northern Iowa and Iowa State University (Iowa State Board of Regents, 2007-2011: Table 1). Nationally, females have outnumbered males in postsecondary institutions since 1978 (Snyder, Tan, and Hoffman, 2003).


Community colleges have become increasingly diverse. In 2007, 12 percent of students were racial or ethnic minorities. This proportion grew to 16 percent in 2010, and 18.5 percent in 2011. Even though the percent of minorities dropped to 16.8 percent in 2012, the five year average growth was 14.7 percent.

Figure 3-5: Credit Student Age: 2012







Figure 3-6: Credit Enrollment by Race and Ethnicity: 2008-2012

In 2010, the Iowa Department of Education changed its reporting methods for race. Students were allowed to identify themselves under multiple racial or ethnic categories. Seventeen hundred sixty-four (1,764) students, or close to eight percent of all minorities, claimed themselves as multi-racial in 2012.





Developmental Education

For this section, a student is identified as enrolled in developmental education if he/she is enrolled in a course numbered below 100 (e.g., MAT 060) or enrolled in a course denoted as "developmental" by the college. However, it is not considered developmental if a course can be used to meet a requirement for the student's major. The Iowa Department of Education determined enrollment in developmental education by matching its community college MIS records with the database of approved community college programs (majors).

During fiscal year 2012, 24,132 students enrolled in a developmental education course (3.8 percent decline from 2011), which represented 15.8 percent of the entire student body. Students enrolled in a total of 121,320 credit hours over the fiscal year, which is 6.3 percent less than the last year.


Many students enrolled in developmental mathematics courses. There were 18,728 students enrolled in developmental mathematics, which far exceeded the 6,846 students enrolling in developmental English classes. Figure 3-8 shows a detailed list of popular developmental education courses. The four most popular developmental education courses were mathematics; MAT062 and MAT063 (Elementary Algebra) were the most popular with a combined enrollment of 7,957 students.

Among English developmental courses, ENG061

(College Preparatory Writing II), ENG013 (Basic Writing), and ENG060 (College Preparatory Writing I) collected the largest enrollment, 4,082 students, or close to 60 percent of all developmental English enrollment.

Similar to the general population of students, most of those who took developmental education were females (57.7 percent). The racial/ethnic minorities, however, comprise 30.0 percent of all developmental education enrollees: a much higher percent than that of the general student population (16.2 percent). The average age for all community college students was 24 years old; yet, the average age for students in developmental education was two years higher: 26. The median age, however, was only 22. The majority of the developmental courses enrollees (over 52 percent) were between ages 18 and 22, with the peak participation being the 19 years old students (Figure 3-9).


Online Credit Enrollment AND DEMOGRAPHICS

The Iowa Department of Education (DE) has collected data on community college enrollment in online coursework since fiscal year 2007. The DE defines an online student as one who is enrolled in one or more courses delivered entirely (100%) online. Data were not collected on hybrid/blended online courses and other distance education delivery methods.

Community college students who were enrolled in online coursework averaged 7.2 credit hours of online courses — 14.3 percent more than in 2008 (Figure 4-2). Of the 2,204,306 total credit hours delivered during fiscal year 2012, 425,977 credit hours (19.3 percent) were delivered online. Table 4-1 summarizes total online credit hours for the latest five years. Table 4-2 summarizes online credit hours delivered by college for the latest five years.

Nationally, over four million students enroll in online classes at community colleges (Parsad and Lewis, 2008). In Iowa, the number of students enrolled in online coursework continued to increase, rising 2.5 percent in fiscal year 2012 to 59,359 students (Figure 4-1). Almost 40 percent of all community college students enrolled in one or more online courses during the fiscal year. Table 4-3 summarizes online enrollment by college for the latest five years.

Online Enrollment by Program

Enrollment in Iowa's community colleges is disaggregated into four program types: college parallel, career option, career and technical education (CTE), and a combination. Tables 4-4 through 4-8 summarize online credit enrollment for each program type by college for individual years from 2008 through 2012. Table 4-9 displays a five-year summary. In 2012, 65.9 percent of students who registered for online courses were enrolled in college parallel programs designed to articulate to a four-year institution (Figure 4-3; Table 4-8). The program type with the second largest enrollment of students taking online coursework was CTE. In fiscal year 2012, about 26 percent of students registered for online courses were enrolled in a CTE program.




Figure 4-4: Online Credit Career and Technical Education Enrollment in One or More Courses by Career ClusterTM for Fiscal Years 2008-2012

Enrollment of CTE students in online coursework has increased; however, when disaggregated by program major, there is significant variation between Career ClustersTM. As with total enrollment, the health sciences Career ClusterTM is the largest with 8,822 students enrolled in one or more online courses (Figure 4-4; Table 4-10). The courses may or may not be within the Career ClusterTM, but students within the program area are increasingly enrolling in online courses. The Career ClusterTM associated with transportation, distribution, and logistics had the largest percentage growth in online enrollment — increasing 19.3 percent from fiscal year 2011. While most Career ClustersTM experienced growth, law, public safety, corrections, and security; marketing; and some Career ClustersTM with smaller enrollment experienced declines in the number of students taking online coursework.





Figure 4-5: FY 2012 Online Career and Technical Education Credit Hours in One or More Courses by Career ClusterTM

The health science Career ClusterTM had 63,489 credit hours delivered online, the most of all the Career ClustersTM. As Figure 4-5 indicates, the Career ClusterTM associated with business, management, and administration had the largest percentage of credit hours delivered online (31.5 percent), followed by human services (31.4 percent) and finance (29.9 percent). The Career ClusterTM associated with government and



public administration had no courses delivered online. Transportation, distribution, and logistics Career Cluster™ had 2.5 percent of credit hours delivered online, followed by architecture and construction (4.5 percent).

Figure 4-3: Online Credit Enrollment by Program Type for Fiscal Years 2008-2012

Jointly Enrolled Students

Jointly enrolled students are less likely to be enrolled in online coursework than the general student body. In fiscal year 2012, 6,521 (16.5 percent) students who participated in joint enrollment programs were also enrolled in one or more online courses, By comparison, almost 40 percent of the general student body enrolled in at least one online course. The number of credit hours delivered via the Internet accounted for 11 percent of all joint enrollment credit hours. By comparison, 19.3 percent of total credit hours were delivered online.

Nationally, 29 percent of public two-year colleges offered distance education courses to jointly enrolled students. In Iowa, all 15 community colleges offer online courses to jointly enrolled students.

Online Student Demographics

Compared with the overall student body, students taking online courses are more likely to be older (26 years old, on average) white females.

In fiscal year 2012, two-thirds of students enrolled in online coursework were female (Table 4-15). By comparison, females accounted for about 56 percent of the total student body (Section 3). The percentage of students enrolled in online coursework that were female was relatively unchanged from fiscal year 2011. Tables 4-11 through 4-15 summarize enrollment by gender and college for individual years, beginning with 2008.

Students enrolled in online coursework are older than the overall student body. The average age of students taking one or more online courses is 26.0 years old — a year and a half older than the average Iowa community college student (Section 3). Students in their late 20s to early 40s enroll in online coursework at higher rates than older or younger age groups. Tables 4-16 through 4-20 summarize enrollment by age and college for individual years, beginning with 2008.

Tables 4-21 through 4-25 summarize enrollment by racial and ethnic subpopulations and college for individual years, beginning with 2008. As with the overall student body, students enrolling in online coursework are predominantly white (77.6 percent). A smaller percentage of students with racial/ethnic minority backgrounds enrolled in online coursework than white students. Blacks accounted for 5.8 percent of students enrolled in online courses; Hispanics, 3.4 percent (Table 4-25).

While students with racial/ethnic minority backgrounds enroll in online coursework at lower rates, the number is growing at a faster rate than for students identified as white (1.9 percent). For example, the number of Hispanic and Black students increased 18.8 and 9.4 percent respectively from 2011.

As Figure 4-6 shows, over 85 percent of students



taking one or more online courses were listed as residents of Iowa for tuition purposes (Table 4-30). However, the number of students who enrolled for online courses as out-of-state residents increased 8.2 percent from fiscal year 2011 to 7,087. Tables 4-26 through 4-30 summarize enrollment by residency status and college for individual years, beginning with 2008.



JOINT ENROLLMENT AND DEMOGRAPHICS

Each year, tens of thousands of Iowa high school students enroll in community college credit coursework. The Department of Education refers to these students as "jointly enrolled."

Joint enrollment of high school students accounts for a quarter of total community college credit enrollment and more than an eighth of total credit hours. Iowa is one of at least 38 states with state dual enrollment policies (Karp, Bailey, Hughes, and Fermin, 2004). In Iowa, high school students enroll in community college credit courses in a variety of ways including Postsecondary Enrollment Option (PSEO), college courses offered through a contract between a local school district and a community college (e.g., concurrent enrollment), and independent enrollment in a college course as a tuitionpaying student.

While sometimes referred to as "dual credit," joint enrollment does not necessarily entail credit being issued at both the secondary and postsecondary levels. Some programs, such as PSEO and concurrent enrollment, require that credit be issued at each level, while other joint enrollment opportunities have no such requirement.

Most joint enrollment opportunities fall under the rubric of Senior Year Plus. The legislation, passed in



2008, consolidated and standardized several existing programs involving college credit opportunities for high school students including PSEO, concurrent enrollment (which entails supplementary weighted funding for local school districts), career and regional academies, and Advanced Placement (AP®). The Community College Management Information System (MIS) captures joint enrollment in three categories — PSEO, contracted courses (which may or may not be concurrent enrollment and generate supplementary weighting for the partnering local district), and tuition.

Joint enrollment in Iowa community colleges has steadily risen to a record high of 39,570 students in

Figure 5-2: Fiscal Year Joint Enrollment Credit Hours: 2004-2012





Figure 5-3: Average Credit Hours per Jointly Enrolled Student: 2004-2012

fiscal year 2012 (Figure 5-1). Since fiscal year 2004, joint enrollment has increased 87.9 percent or over 8.2 percent per year. Since fiscal year 2010, the annual growth dropped significantly and stabilized around 1.7 percent.

Enrollment growth of jointly enrolled students outlasted the growth of total credit enrollment which declined 1.8 percent in fiscal year 2012, for the first time in 13 years of the MIS reporting history (Section 3).

The number of average credit hours taken by each student remained at the 7.7 mark, the same number as last year (Figure 5-3). The number of credit hours taken per jointly enrolled student has increased about one credit hour since fiscal year 2004. Special analysis in 2008 showed that jointly enrolled students take slightly less than three classes on average. Because high school students generally enroll part-time, they account for a smaller proportion of total credit hours than for total enrollment (Figure 5-4). In fiscal year 2012, joint enrollment accounted for 13.8 percent of total credit hours.

The rate at which high school students enroll in community college coursework varies by local school district and community college region (Figure 5-10). Nationally, public two-year colleges offer college credit coursework to high school students at higher rates than other sectors of higher education (Kleiner and Lewis, 2005). In 2005, 98 percent of public two-year colleges nationwide had high school students jointly enrolled in college credit coursework compared with 77 of public four-year institutions. In Iowa, delivery of programs to high school students is a part of the community colleges'




mission (Iowa Code 260C.1) and, consequently, all 15 community colleges are committed to offering college credit opportunities to these students.

Joint Enrollment Offering Arrangements

Contracted courses had the largest enrollment of the three types of joint enrollment offering arrangements, accounting for 85.5 percent of jointly enrolled students in fiscal year 2012 (Figure 5-5). Enrollment in contracted courses rose three percent from the previous year to 36,014 students. PSEO, which accounts for 9.9 percent of joint enrollment, fell by 6.6 percent from fiscal year 2011. Enrollment of tuition-paying students fell 17.4 percent over the prior year, a second year of a significant decline.


Iowa's Typical Jointly Enrolled Student Caucasian Young Female Resident

Figure 5-6: Jointly Enrolled Credit **Student Gender: 2012**




JOINT ENROLLMENT

Jointly Enrolled Student Demographics

The typical jointly enrolled student, as with prior years, is female, 18 years old, and white. Compared with the overall student body, jointly enrolled students are proportionally more white and male. In fiscal year 2012, approximately 50.1 percent of joint enrollees were female compared with 56 percent of the overall student body (Figure 5-6). The phenomenon of proportionally greater male enrollment is driven by contracted course enrollment, which was 51.2 percent male in fiscal year 2012. In terms of gender, contracted course enrollment more closely mirrors high school enrollment than community college enrollment. In contrast, PSEO and tuition enrollment were 64 percent and 64.5 percent female, respectively.

The racial/ethnic background of joint enrollees is less diverse than either total community college enrollment or public K-12 enrollment. In fiscal year 2012, approximately 12 percent of joint enrollees were reported as having a minority racial/ethnic background. Tuition course enrollment had the largest proportion of minority students (13.7 percent), followed by contracted course

(12.0 percent) and PSEO (5.6 percent). Hispanics were the largest minority group with 45.0 percent of minority joint enrollment, followed by Asian and Black students, with 19.4 percent and 18.5 percent respectively (Figure 5-7). In contrast, 16.8 percent of the overall community college student body was reported to have a minority racial/ethnic background, 42.5 percent of which were black and 29.4 percent of which were Hispanic.


As expected, jointly enrolled students were younger than the overall community college student body, but few were younger than age 17 (18.5 percent). More than 76.8 percent of jointly enrolled students were age 17 or 18 (Figure 5-8).

Jointly enrolled students were also almost exclusively (99.6 percent) reported as residents of Iowa for tuition purposes. Only 158 out-of-state and ten international students were jointly enrolled during fiscal year 2013 (Table 5-18).

Grade Level of Jointly Enrolled Students

Jointly enrolled students tend to be high school upperclass students; in particular, seniors. More than 83 percent of jointly enrolled students were in their last two years of high school. Seniors accounted for 50 percent of jointly enrolled students while more than a third were juniors (Figure 5-9). Data on student grade level is derived through a match between the state's K-12 data repository and the Community College MIS.

CREDIT STUDENT AWARDS

Award counts include the same student each time the student receives an award during this period of time. In 2012, the number of awards increased, but the composition of community college awardees remained relatively the same.

In 2011, the number of awards increased by 12.7 percent, compared to 2010. In 2012 the number of awards increased again by 4.3 percent to a record high 18,696. On average, the number of awards in Iowa community colleges has increased four percent since tracking began in fiscal year 2000. Overall, the number of awards has been steady since year 2006, fluctuating between years 2000 and 2005, and on the rise continuously since year 2010 (Figure 6-1).

There are a variety of credit student awards granted by Iowa community colleges. Awards offered include Associate of Arts (AA), Associate of Science (AS), Associate of General Studies (AGS), Associate of Applied Arts (AAA), Associate in Applied Science (AAS), diplomas, and certificates. AA awards comprised 5,410 (28.9 percent) of the total credit student awards granted during fiscal year 2012. AAS awards accounted for another 5,223 (27.9 percent) of awards issued. The CREDIT AWARDS

share of AS awards increased from 7.9 percent in 2011 to 8.0 percent in 2012. The share of certificates increased from 12.2 to 13.4 percent, to a record high 2,504 between the same years; number of diplomas decreased to 18.6 percent of all awards for a total of 3,481.

Credit student awards by program majors have remained fairly consistent over the past five years. All areas reflect some fluctuations between fiscal year 2006 and fiscal year 2012. In career and technical education (CTE) programs, the largest number of awards was granted in health science, followed by business, manufacturing, transportation, distribution and logistics, architecture and construction, and agriculture, food, and natural resources programs. Steadily over the last

Figure 6-1: Awards by Type: 2000-2012





Figure 6-2: Fiscal Year Student Award by Program Major: 2012

13 years, the prevailing number of degrees (close to 68 percent) were associate degrees, followed by diplomas and certificates (Figure 6-2).

Although the national data does not classify program areas in the same educational clusters, recent data is analogous to Iowa community colleges. Similar to Iowa, most awards were granted in general studies intended to prepare for a four-year degree, followed by health/ clinical sciences, and business (Provasnik and Planty, 2008).

Awardees Demographics


The typical community college awardee is a white female with an AA or AAS degree in health science. In general, the same distribution is true for credit student enrollment; the awards, however, tend to be distributed even more heavily toward women. While 56 percent of all enrollees in Iowa community colleges in 2012 were women, nearly 60 percent of all awardees in 2012 were women (Figure 6-3). Nationally, women also earn more awards than men (National Center for Educational Statistics, NCES, 2010): 62 percent of Associate Degree awards were given to women in the U.S.

A similar trend was present for the racial distribution: although whites comprised close to 83 percent of Iowa community college enrollees in 2012, they comprised 90.1 percent of all community college awardees.

Nationally, however, whites comprised only 66.3 percent of all Associate degree recipients (NCES, 2010).

The distribution of awards among racial minorities does not mirror enrollment, either. Blacks were still the largest group of enrollees among the racial and ethnic

Figure 6-3: Awards by Gender: 2012






Figure 6-4: Awards by Racial and Ethnic **Minorities: 2012**

minorities (44.5 percent) in 2012, but comprised only 36 percent of minority awardees; the students of Hispanic origin also comprised 36 percent of all awardees among racial and ethnic minorities, with only 29.4 percent of all minority enrollees in 2012 (Figure 6-4).

Similar to all awardees, the overwhelming majority of awards received by racial minorities in 2012 fell into twoyear degrees (66.7 percent), followed by diplomas (17.7 percent), and certificates (15.6 percent). The number of awards among racial and ethnic minorities kept growing, with some fluctuations, between the years of 2000 and 2012 (Figure 6-6), consistent with the growth of the overall community college population.

In 2012, over 41 percent of all CTE awards were in health science. The gender distribution, however, is even higher—61.3 percent of all CTE awards received by women were in health science. Women also lead in business, human services, arts and communications, while men received more awards in transportation, manufacturing, architecture and construction and agriculture (Figure 6-5).

The majority of CTE awards for racial and ethnic minorities were among health science students, followed by awards in business. The distribution of awards was similar to all awardees; for example, 42.6 percent of

all CTE awards fell into health science for minorities (Figure 6-7).

CREDIT PROGRAMS

Iowa's community colleges are required to obtain approval from the Iowa Department of Education (DE) for all programs. All 15 colleges have approval to offer arts and sciences programs, which are recorded under a single Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) title. "Liberal Arts and Sciences/Liberal Studies." These twoyear Associate of Arts (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) degree programs prepare students to enter a four-year college or university with junior standing. Each Iowa community college maintains details regarding its specific pre-professional offerings.

In contrast, community college career and technical education (CTE) programs are recorded under many CIP titles and structured around the National Career ClustersTM Framework, which consists of the 16 Career ClustersTM listed in Figure 7-2. The Career ClustersTM represents distinct groupings of occupations and industries based on the knowledge and skills they require.1

New Credit Programs

During fiscal year 2012, 23 new CTE programs for seven community colleges were approved by the Iowa Department of Education. Table 7-1 provides a summary of the specific programs approved. Slightly more than half of the new programs were contained in two Career ClustersTM, with nine programs added in health science and four added in arts, a/v technology and communications. Two new programs were added in each of the following Career ClustersTM: architecture and construction; manufacturing; and business, management and administration. The agriculture, food, and natural resources; transportation, distribution, and logistics; hospitality and tourism; and information technology Career ClustersTM each benefited from one new program.


Each of the 16 Career ClustersTM is categorized into one of seven CTE service areas recognized within Iowa. Figure 7-3 illustrates the percentage of new programs developed in fiscal year 2012 by state service area.

Figure 7-4 indicates 70 percent (16 total) of the new CTE programs offered an associate degree, while 13 percent (3 total) offered a diploma award, and 17 percent (4 total) offered a stand-alone certificate award. These percentages represent the highest award offered within the new program. It is possible for a program to include multiple award types.

Career and Technical Education Programs


In addition to introducing new programs, Iowa community colleges are provided three opportunities annually to submit requests to modify existing programs.

Modification requests include changes in courses comprising a program, changes in awards offered, and requests to discontinue programs. Occasionally, CTE program modifications are also necessary due to changes in industry requirements and/or program classification. For fiscal year 2012, this was the case for several nursingrelated and emergency medical technology/technician (EMT) program offerings.

During the 2012 fiscal year, Iowa's community colleges offered 760 programs with 1,427 award options. The colleges offered 249 unique technical programs representing a variety of careers. Even though some programs were discontinued, the total offerings for 2012 increased from 2011. This reflects increases of 5.1 percent in the total number of programs offered, 2.5 percent in the number of unique CTE programs and 7.9 percent in the number of award options, as compared to 2011. Non-Credit Enrollment AND PROGRAMS

Non-credit programs contain a variety of instructional offerings including personal and academic basic skill development, skill development for preparation of individuals entering the workforce, technical courses directly related to specific industry-based work opportunities, and courses to pursue special interests.




Figure 8-2: Fiscal Year Non-Credit Contact Hours: 2004-2012

In fiscal year 2012, 248,440 individuals participated in non-credit programs and courses. Enrollment experienced ups and downs between 2004 and 2008, but then decreased an average of 2.4 percent a year (Figure 8-1) from 2008 to 2012. The same pattern is applicable to contact hours: fluctuation before 2008, and steady decline (4.1 percent annually) since 2008 (Figure 8-2). Contact hours fell 0.4 percent since 2011; however, they increased by 0.2 percent to 30.5 hours since last year, when counted as average per student.

Non-Credit Courses and Programs





Figure 8-3: Non-Credit Courses **Delivered: 2004-2012**

Enrollment in non-credit courses is disaggregated into several program categories and was manifested by 430,041 courses in 2012 (Figure 8-3). The largest of these categories (46.9 percent in 2012) consisted of non-credit courses designed to enhance students' employability or





academic success. The second largest category of noncredit enrollment included programs and courses that were designed for relicensure and recertification (17.2 percent of all programs), followed by state or federally mandated, state recognized, or court ordered or referred courses (17.0 percent, Figure 8-5). Courses within this category include the Iowa Course for Drinking Drivers, driver improvement courses, community rehabilitation programs, used auto dealer training, mine safety and health courses, various vehicle operator training courses, and many more. Enrollment within this category has been steady, between 16 percent and 18 percent of all courses annually.

Figure 8-1: Fiscal Year Non-Credit Enrollment: 2004-2012



Online Non-Credit Courses

After an increase of 90 percent in online course enrollment from 2008 to 2010, student online enrollment decreased 51.6 percent in 2011; in 2012 it dropped additional 29 percent (Figure 8-4).

Overall, the use of the online delivery for non-credit coursework appears to be limited. Less than 0.002 percent of non-credit contact hours were delivered online in fiscal year 2012. Less than one percent of noncredit students enrolled in coursework delivered entirely online in 2012.

State and Federally Mandated Programs

As stated in the title, this category consists of the state or federally mandated, court ordered or referred noncredit courses and programs that are designed to meet legislated or licensing requirements as defined in the Code of Iowa.

State and federally mandated coursework enrollment declined by 3.5 percent from 2011 to 2012 (Figure 8-6). The average annual decrease in enrollment in this category from 2008 to 2012 has been 3.4 percent.

State and federally mandated programs vary in their scope and level of enrollment, as seen from Figure 8.7.

Recertification and Relicensure

The coursework under this category is designed for individuals employed in occupations that require less than a four-year degree and whose positions require them to be re-certified or relicensed (e.g., chemical application, insurance). It is also designed for individuals employed in occupations that require a four-year college degree or above, and who are required to be re-certified or re-licensed through the coursework that does not lead to an additional degree.

Recertification and relicensure enrollment decreased by ten percent in 2012. However, average annual enrollment between 2008 and 2012 demonstrates a 2.2 percent increase (Figures 8-8 and 8-9).

Figure 8-6: State and Federally Mandated, Recognized, Court Ordered or Referred **Enrollment: 2008-2012**




Figure 8-7: State/Federal Mandated, Recognized, Court Ordered Referred Programs AARP Driver (55 Alive) and Recreation Vehicle Safety Child/Dependent Abuse Mandatory Reporting Coaching Authorization Court Ordered/Referred **Drivers Education** Hazardous Material State Recognized Course Hunter Safety and Ethics Iowa Course for Drinking Drivers (DUI) Iowa Course for Drivers Improvement (DIP) Mine Safety and Health Admin. (MSHA) Motorcycle Rider Motorized Bicycle (Moped) Non-Professional Permit to Carry Weapons Training Non-Professional Permit to Carry Weapons Training Parenting Skills/Human Growth and Development Professional Permit to Carry Weapons Training Professional Permit to Carry Weapons Training Reserved Peace Officer Training School Bus Driver Snowmobile Safety Used Motor Vehicle Dealers Watercraft/Jet Ski 2,000 4,000 6,000 8,000

Figure 8-8: Re-certification and Re-licensure Programs





Figure 8-9: Re-certification/Re-licensure Enrollment: 2008-2012


Non-Credit Community Rehabilitation and Sheltered Workshops

As a part of Adult Basic Education, Iowa community colleges deliver programs for people in community rehabilitation centers (sheltered workshops).


Figure 8-10: Community Rehabilitation and Sheltered Workshop Enrollment: 2008-2012

Enrollment in these programs has decreased sharply over the past five years—an average of 15.8 percent annually between 2008 and 2012 (Figure 8-10). Eight colleges reported enrollment and contact hours in sheltered workshops in 2012. In six of the eight colleges, enrollment decreased since last year. Only Eastern Iowa Community College increased enrollment in this category, and Indian Hills Community College maintained it on the level of 2011. Though contact hours decreased in five of the eight colleges from 2011 to 2012, statewide they increased by 1.2 percent (Table 8-12).

Numbers fluctuations in this category may be partially due to reclassification of categories: basic skill category joined sheltered workshop category in 2011.

Non-Credit Mine Safety and Health

The Iowa Department of Education administers a federal grant from the U.S. Department of Labor and Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA), which provides funds for training and services delivered to mine owners/operators/contractors in the state of Iowa. Enrollment in MSHA programs fluctuated between 2004 and 2009, and dropped dramatically (close to 68 percent) in 2010, remained low in 2011 and almost doubled in 2012 (Figure 8-11).

Figure 8-11: MSHA Enrollment: 2004-2012



Non-Credit Drinking Drivers (DUI) Course **Enrollment: 2008-2012**


Figure 8-12: Iowa Drinking Driver Course **Enrollment: 2008-2012**

The Iowa Course for Drinking Drivers is the statemandated course for drivers convicted of driving while under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol. Iowa community colleges and private providers, licensed through the Iowa Department of Public Health, offer the state-approved program. Enrollment in drinking driver education courses decreased an average of three percent annually between 2008 and 2012, with a significant 11 percent decline from 2010 to 2011. (Figure 8-12). Contact hours decreased an average of 1.9 percent annually between 2008 and 2012 with the largest decline of 10.1 percent occurring between 2010 and 2011 (Table 8-10).

Non-Credit Driver Improvement (DIP) Enrollment: 2008-2012

Iowa Course for Driver Improvement (DIP) is the state-mandated course designed for persons who have committed a serious violation of a motor vehicle law in Iowa. Iowa community colleges provide the program with the assistance from the Iowa Department of Transportation. Enrollment in the program decreased an average of 8.1 percent annually from fiscal year 2008 fiscal year 2012 (Figure 8-13). Contact hours for the Iowa Driver Improvement courses decreased an average of 8.6 percent annually from 2008 to 2012 with the most significant decline of 18.1 occurring between program years 2010 and 2011. Contact hours decreased an additional 13.4 percent between program years 2011 and 2012 (Table 8-11).

Figure 8-13: Iowa Driver Improvement **Enrollment: 2008-2012**



Enrollment in Correctional Institutions


Figure 8-14: Corrections Enrollment: 2008-2012

Iowa community colleges delivered credit and noncredit coursework to residents of correctional institutions to enhance the life, academic skills and/or employability success of criminal offenders. Enrollment of these individuals in credit coursework is historically small; however, 3,121 residents of correctional institutions enrolled in non-credit coursework in fiscal year 2012 (Figure 8-14). Enrollment decreased 4.4 percent from 2008 to 2012 annually on average, and contact hours decreased an average of 0.5 percent annually during the same years.

Used Motor Vehicle Dealer Education


Figure 8-15: Used Motor Vehicle Dealer **Education Enrollment: 2009-2012**

The Used Motor Vehicle Dealer coursework ensures pre-licensing requirements are met for used auto dealers in Iowa. The curriculum is delivered through continuing education departments at Iowa community colleges. The pre-licensing requirements were established in Iowa Code (Chapter 21) in 2009. The number of students enrolled in used auto dealer courses has fluctuated significantly between 2009 and 2010 (56 percent decrease); increased a dramatic 201 percent between 2010 and 2011, before it dropped 74 percent in 2012. The average annual enrollment has decreased 29.8 percent from 2009 to 2012. Contact hours decreased an average of 25.9 percent from 2009 to 2012, following the pattern of the enrollment changes between program years (Figure 8-15).

Community and Public Policy

Community and Public Safety Policy is a program that focuses on the systematic analysis of public policy issues and decision processes. Classes include instruction in the role of economic and political factors in public decisionmaking and policy formation, and microeconomic analysis of policy issues. Enrollment in Community and Public Policy programs decreased an average of 15.3 percent annually from 2009 to 2012 (Figure 8-16).

Non-Credit Skill Enhancement Enrollment by Career ClustersTM


Skill enhancement courses in the non-credit reporting categories are designed to provide short-term programs and non-credit courses for the specific purpose of training persons for employment, upgrading the skills of persons presently employed, and retraining persons for new employment. Courses and programs designated as short term preparatory are also included within this category. Skill enhancement courses include many options that align with the 16 national Career ClustersTM, the framework for organizing and delivering career and technical education programs. There are over 79 career pathways related to the national Career ClustersTM, designed to broaden career and occupational options.

In fiscal year 2012, 119,283 students were enrolled in skill enhancement courses with 114.520 reported in one of the 16 national Career ClustersTM (Table 8-18). Colleges reported over 2,169,103 contact hours

with 2,092,601, or 96.5 percent of the total contact hours reported as taken within one or more of the 16 national Career ClustersTM. As with credit enrollment at the Iowa community colleges, non-credit enrollment, distributed among national career clusters, contains a high percentage of students in health sciences, business, management and administration, and manufacturing. For a comparison with credit student enrollment, see Section 3, Fiscal Year Credit Enrollment.

Over 58,600 students were enrolled in non-credit health science courses in fiscal year 2012. Health science enrollment exceeded 49 percent of the total enrollment for skill enhancement course and program category. Colleges reported 12.5 percent of enrollees in business, management, and administration courses and programs, 9.9 percent of enrollees in manufacturing, 5.3 percent in law public safety and security, four percent in transportation, distribution and logistics, 3.4 percent in agriculture, food and natural resources, 3.4 percent in human services, and 2.7 percent of enrollees in architecture and construction (Figures 8-17 and 8-18).

Gender and race/ethnicity of Skill Enhancement Programs Participants

Historically, females have composed most of community college credit enrollment, remaining steady between 55 and 57 percent. The trend is similar in noncredit enrollment in occupational specific coursework. In fiscal year 2012, females represented 53 percent of enrollment and males represented 47 percent. Conclusions based on reported gender data should be made cautiously as 26,571 enrollees, or 23 percent, were reported without a gender category.

Similar situation exists with the reporting of race/ethnicity: in fiscal year 2012, 62.5 percent of students enrolled in skill enhancement courses were reported without race. The 36 percent reported in the racial category consisted of predominately Whites (91.2 percent); Blacks comprised 3.9 percent, Hispanics presented 3.1 percent. The remaining race categories totaled less than two percents combined (Figure 8-20).

Figure 8-20: Non-Credit Skill Enhancement Programs Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity





ADULT LITERACY ENROLLMENT AND PROGRAMS

Iowa's adult literacy programs are delivered through the state's 15 community colleges. Through non-credit instruction, adult literacy programs are delivered on a continuum from English as a Second Language (ESL) to earning a high school equivalency diploma (GED®). Adult learners develop competence in reading, writing, speaking, problem-solving, and computation. set instruction is contextualized within the workforce competency curriculum.




Figure 9-1: Adult Literacy Program Enrollment: 2004-2012

Adult literacy program enrollment, reported through the Community College Management Information System (MIS), has decreased an average of 2.1 percent annually from fiscal year 2008 to 2012 (Figure 9-1). In 2012, 26,635 students were enrolled in adult literacy programs including a subset (10,921) that was included in the federal reporting of adult literacy students.

Total adult literacy enrollment data collected through the MIS includes all students who attended at least one,



50-minute class period. The subset of adult literacy students meeting National Reporting System (NRS) requirements is included in year-end federal reporting. While only a portion of the overall population served by adult literacy programs, this subset represents learners achieving outcomes fundamental to academic and vocational success. The NRS is the accountability system for the federally-funded Adult Education and

Family Literacy Act (AEFLA), state administered adult education program. The NRS specifies parameters for students to be included in reporting to the U.S. Department of Education Office of Vocational and Adult Education (OVAE). For reporting purposes learners must be 16 years old, may not be jointly enrolled in high school, and must be enrolled in an eligible program. NRS reported learners are the subset of learners demonstrating persistence, academic gain, and goal-setting and outcomes that include passing a General Educational Development (GED®) test, entering postsecondary education or training, and obtaining or retaining employment.

MIS-reported enrollment has declined 2 percent from 2004 to 2012 while NRS reported enrollment has declined 10.8 percent from 2004-2012. In 2009 OVAE changed NRS data parameters to include a required minimum hours of instruction before post-assessment. In turn, Iowa programs are required to report all students served with AEFLA funding into the NRS-reported data base. Over time, the expectation is that federally-

Figure 9-2: Adult Literacy Enrollment by Program: 2004-2012




ADULT LITERACY PROGRAM ENROLLMENT



reported data will increase to levels congruent with MIS-reported state general aid reimbursable enrollment and that expectation has been met in the past four years. NRS-reported enrollment increases began in 2009 and continued through 2011 with a 17.8 percent NRS enrollment increase from 2008 to 2012.

Enrollment in Instructional Programs

Adult literacy instructional programs represent a progression of basic skill attainment. Instructional programs include ESL, Adult Basic Education (ABE) skill attainment, and Adult Secondary Education (ASE). At the ASE level, individuals may obtain a GED® diploma or an adult high school diploma issued by the community college.

ESL instructional programs are designed for individuals with limited English proficiency (speaking, reading, writing, or comprehension) to increase competence in English. MIS enrollment in ESL instructional programs decreased an average of 4.3 percent annually between 2008 and 2012 (Figure 9-2). NRS-reported ESL enrollment increased 6.8 percent (Figure 9-3).

ABE instructional programs are designed for adults lacking competence in reading, writing, speaking, problem-solving, or computation at a level to function in society, employment, or in a family. Enrollment in ABE programs has decreased an average of 4.3 percent annually since 2008. NRS reported enrollment in ABE programs declined 5.8 percent from 2008 to 2012, in part because of local program compliance coding according to NRS educational functioning level guidelines.

Through ASE instructional programs, students acquire the skills to earn an Iowa High School Equivalency Diploma by passing the GED® test battery or earn an adult high school diploma issued upon successful completion of courses delivered by community colleges. MIS enrollment in ASE GED® and adult high school

diploma) programs has decreased an average of 1.8 percent annually from 2008 to 2012, due in part, to a change in the way colleges enroll students in courses titled "GED®" instead of "ABE" (Figure 9.5). NRS reported GED® program enrollment decreased 3.4 percent from 2008 to 2012.

Adult Literacy Grade Level Completions

Iowa's adult literacy program uses the federallyapproved Comprehensive Adult Student Assessment System (CASAS) to assess all incoming students for grade level placement. The CASAS inventory aligns placement with participants' goals of learning English as a second language, acquiring basic skills, or earning a GED® or diploma. By 2014, the CASAS assessment




Figure 9-4: Grade Level Completions: 2006-2012




inventory will be aligned with the Common Core¹.

Upon entry and assessment, students are placed into grade levels equivalent to grades one through 12 in as many as up to four subject areas -- reading, math, writing, and listening. After 70-100 hours of instructional intervention (or a minimum of 40 hours), students are assessed for grade level completions.


In 2012, 3,213 participants persisting beyond 40 hours of instruction, took a post-assessment, and completed or advanced at least one grade level in the fiscal year (Figure 9.4). Between 2006 and 2012, 31,922 participants, out of 71,990, or 44 percent of all participants persisting beyond 40 hours of instruction completed or advanced at least one grade level within the fiscal year of participation.



ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The Iowa Department of Education began reporting enrollment in Iowa Industrial New Jobs Training Programs (260E), Iowa Jobs Training Programs (260F), and Accelerated Career Education (ACE 260G) programs based on data provided by the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA).

The State of Iowa has established a series of programs, usually referred to by their chapter number in the Code of Iowa, targeted toward workforce development. The Iowa Industrial New Jobs Training Programs (260E), Iowa Jobs Training Programs (260F), and Accelerated Career Education (ACE 260G) are delivered through community colleges, but funding is provided through the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA).

The Iowa Industrial New Jobs Training Programs assist businesses that are creating new jobs within the state. Iowa Jobs Training Programs are designed to build workforce skills and expertise. Finally, the Accelerated Career Education (ACE) program helps community colleges expand programs that are critically needed in the workforce. Unlike 260E and 260F programs, ACE is primarily delivered through credit programs.

Iowa Industrial New Jobs Training Programs (260E)

Iowa Industrial New Jobs Training Programs (260E) assist businesses that are creating new positions or new jobs in Iowa. The community college district in which the new or expanding business is located issues training certificates (bonds) to pay for the training costs. Flexible funding may be utilized to meet a variety of training and employee development needs.

The training dollars awarded for this program continue to fluctuate from year to year. The training dollars


Figure 10-1: Training Dollars Awarded for 260E Programs: 2007-2011 \$70,000,000 \$60,000,000 \$50,000,000 \$40,000,000 \$30,000,000 -\$20,000,000 \$10,000,000 2007 2008 2009 2010 2011 Source: Iowa Economic Development Authority, Workforce Business Service Training Annual Reports: 2011, see Table 10-1.

awarded have declined 52 percent since fiscal year (FY) 2007 and declined 16 percent from the previous year.

The number of new businesses assisted by this program decreased to 14 in 2011, five fewer than the previous year. Since FY 2007 the number of new businesses has decreased 36 percent while this number decreased 26 percent from the previous year.


Business expansions increased to 92 in FY 2011 versus 89 in FY 2010. Overall this number is still down from the 5 year high of 126 in FY 2007.

Figure 10-2: Business Expansions for 260E Programs: 2007-2011





Figure 10-4: Training Dollars Awarded for 260F Programs: 2007-2011





Iowa Jobs Training Programs (260F)

Iowa Jobs Training Programs (260F) foster growth and competitiveness of Iowa's business and industry by building workforce skills and expertise. This program provides job training services to current employees of eligible businesses which are located in Iowa. This program is administered by IEDA and services are provided by Iowa's 15 community colleges. Each community college works with eligible businesses to assess training needs, determine funds availability and provide training.

The number of projects awarded continues to fluctuate. From FY 2007, a total of 1,075 projects have been awarded, with three fewer projects awarded in FY 2011 compared to the previous year. Compared to FY 2007, FY 2011 had nine fewer projects awarded for a total of 202 for the year.

ACE (260G) Programs

The number of individuals to be trained and the number who completed this program continue to fluctuate from year to year. Since FY 2007, 29,467 individuals were classified to be trained and 33,653 completed the training. In FY 2011, 514 more individuals were classified to be trained than in FY 2007 and 4,871 fewer individuals completed the training than in FY 2007.

The training dollars awarded for this program decreased in FY 2011. The training dollars awarded has increased just over one percent since FY 2007.


Accelerated Career Education (ACE 260G)

Accelerated Career Education (ACE 260G) supports the development or expansion of educational programs that address critical workforce needs. The goal of the program is to provide an enhanced skilled workforce in Iowa.

The number of companies with signed agreements has decreased from 73 to 50 since FY 2008. This represents a decrease of 31 percent. Since FY 2010, this number has decreased nine percent.


The number of sponsored programs continue to decrease. Since FY 2008, 740 programs have been sponsored. The number of programs sponsored has decreased to 76 in FY 2011, down from 263 in FY 2008. This represents a decrease of 71 percent over the past

Figure 10-7: Positions Sponsored for 260G Programs: 2007-2011





four years.

The total number of positions sponsored per year has decreased from FY 2010 and has decreased from five years ago. In FY 2008, 2,369 positions were sponsored, and this decreased to 1,844 in FY 2011. A total of 8,504 positions have been sponsored since FY 2008.

The dollar amount of job credits awarded indicates that overall this amount has decreased 17.1 percent since FY 2008. The amount awarded in FY 2011 decreased 9.7 percent from the previous year.

APPRENTICESHIP


Apprenticeship programs utilize the most up-todate technologies available in the workplace. The Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training must approve all apprenticeship projects funded through the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA). This section includes apprenticeship programs offered through the community colleges and funded through IEDA, as well as apprenticeship programs not funded through IEDA.

In fiscal year 2012, the total number of unduplicated students in all apprenticeship programs decreased by 661 from the previous year. The number of students in noncredit apprenticeship programs decreased by 24.3



percent during that time period and the number of noncredit contact hours decreased by 24.3 percent. Since fiscal year 2008, the number of non-credit students has

decreased by 1,154. The number of non-credit contact hours taken has decreased by 185,917.

The number of students in credit apprenticeship programs increased by 15 while the number of credit hours taken in fiscal year 2012 decreased by 54 from fiscal year 2011. Since fiscal year 2008, the number of credit students has increased by 132 and the number of credit hours taken has increased by 1,762.

IEDA-Funded Apprenticeship Programs


The Iowa New Jobs Training Program (260E) assists businesses which are creating new positions or new jobs. The dollar amount available for training through the program is dependent upon the training and development needs and projected tax revenue available to repay the certificates. Applications for this program must be made through the local community college.

The Iowa Jobs Training Program (260F) provides job training services to current employees of eligible businesses which are located in Iowa. Job training services are defined as any training needed to enhance the performance of a business' employees. This program is administered by the IEDA and services are provided by Iowa's 15 community colleges. Each community college works with eligible businesses to assess training needs, determine funds availability and provide training. Since fiscal year 2008, the number of students participating decreased by 249 while the number of contact hours decreased by 22,159. The number of students decreased 82 from the previous year while the total contact hours decreased by 19,935.

Programs Not Funded by IEDA

The number of students participating in non-credit apprenticeship programs that were not funded by economic development programs decreased by 29 from fiscal year 2008 to fiscal year 2012. The number of contact hours decreased 7,755 over the previous five years. The number of students increased by five from the previous year but the number of contact hours decreased by 659.4.

Figure 11-3: Apprenticeship Credit Hours: 2008-2012



STUDENT SUCCESS

Students enroll in community colleges for several reasons. Some students plan to earn an award such as a diploma or an Associates degree, others intend to transfer credits earned at a community college to a four-year college or university. Other students enroll to update their job skills. Students who achieve their goals contribute to various components of student success.

Success, however, transcends graduation and transfer rates. For example, improving one's job skills through adult basic education is another measure of success. Adults lacking a high school diploma or GED are at an economic disadvantage compared to those with higher levels of education. By acquiring new skills and completing adult basic education, students can enter or return to the labor market as more economically productive citizens.

Definitions and Methodology

Definitions

The following definitions apply to this chapter:

Cohort. A group of students as defined by a set of criteria. Unless noted otherwise, a cohort consists of first-time students enrolled full-time.

First-time student. A student whose first enrollment date occurred any time during a given fiscal year at any given community college within the State of Iowa.

Full-time student. A student who registered for at least 24 semester hours, or equivalent quarter hours, during a given fiscal year.

Graduation rate. The percentage of students within a cohort who earned an two-year award within three years.

Transfer rate. The percentage of students within a cohort who transferred from a community college to a four-year college or university, inside or outside the State of Iowa, within three years.

Success rate. The sum of graduation and transfer rates of students within a cohort.

Methodology

Every year the Iowa Department of Education follows cohorts of first-time full-time students over a threeyear span. This span of time follows federal and state guidelines that allow students 150 percent of the allotted time to complete a degree.

STUDENT OUTCOMES

OVERALL TRANSFER RATE:

Data from student records of each cohort are used to calculate graduation, transfer, and success rates specific to that cohort. Applying the definitions from the previous section, the FY 2010 cohort had 11,427 full-time students who were enrolled for the first time at any of Iowa's community colleges.

Success Rates

The overall success rate for the FY 2010 cohort was 50.1 percent. Table 12-1 summarizes overall success rates by community college for FY 2005-FY 2007 cohorts and the FY 2010 cohort.

Success rates differed by race and ethnicity. For the cohort of FY 2010, the success rate among White students was 52.9 percent; among Black students, 39.0 percent, among Hispanic students, 39.3 percent; among Asian students, 51.5 percent; and among Native American students, 37.5 percent. Tables 12-4 through 12-7 provide summaries by college.

The difference in success rates between genders, as summarized in Table 12-8, was 3.1 percentage points. Among females in the FY 2010 cohort, 51.7 percent either graduated or transferred, whereas 48.6 percent of males either graduated or transferred.

Graduation Rates

The overall graduation rate among students of the FY 2010 cohort was 27.1 percent. This rate, compared to data published by the National Center of Education Statistics (NCES) (2012), was similar to the national average for all two-year institutions (27.5 percent) and higher than the national average of public two-year institutions (20.6 percent). Table 12-2 summarizes data for overall graduation rates of cohorts from FY 2001 through FY 2010. Table 12-9 displays overall graduation

rates by college for the five most recent cohorts.

Graduation rates differed by race and ethnicity. Within the FY 2010 cohort, 41.7 percent of White students graduated within three years. However, during the same period, Black students had a graduation rate of 12.5 percent; Hispanic students, 23.2 percent; Asian students, 19.0 percent; and Native American students, 22.5 percent. Tables 12-10 through 12-14 summarize graduation rates by ethnicity for each of the five most recent cohorts.

The difference in graduation rates between genders was inconsequential. Almost 28 percent of females and 27 percent of males graduated within three years. The national graduation rates among students attending public two-year institutions were 20.8 percent for females and 19.9 percent for males. Tables 12-15 through 12-19 display overall graduation rates by gender for each of the three most recent cohorts.

Transfer Rates

Among students of the FY 2010 cohort, the transfer rate was 22.9 percent, 2.5 percentage points lower than the national average (NCES, 2001). Table 12-3

summarizes transfer rates for cohorts of FY 2006, FY 2007, and FY 2010.

Transfer rates differed by race and ethnicity. Within the FY 2010 cohort, 69.4 percent of White students transferred within three years. However, during the same period, the transfer rate among Black students was 8.4 percent; among Hispanic students, 2.4 percent; among Asian students, 2.0 percent; and among Native American students, 0.5 percent. Figure 12-1 displays transfer rates of Iowa community college students by ethnicity compared to U. S averages.

The difference in transfer rates between genders was 2.8 percentage points. Among females, 48.6 percent transferred. Among males, 51.4 percent transferred. The national averages among students attending public two-year institutions were 20.8 percent for females and 19.9 percent for males.

Wages of Graduates


Education gives employees the tools to be more economically productive throughout their careers. Wages earned over one's lifetime tend to increase as one's level of education increases. The Iowa Department

of Education reviewed unemployment insurance records of community college graduates.

Methodology

This section relies upon data collected under two different calendaring systems: fiscal year and calendar year. These systems are offset by two quarters. For example, the first quarter of a fiscal year (July 1 through September 30) corresponds to the third quarter of a calendar year.

For purposes of this section, a year is defined as a calendar year (January 1 through December 31). Discussion of quarters, therefore, are based upon calendar quarters, with the first quarter beginning January 1 and ending March 31.

Iowa Workforce Development collects information about wages from unemployment insurance (UI) records, which are generated each quarter. Most students graduate during the second quarter. To allow graduates time to secure employment, UI records were collected from the fourth quarter.

Weekly wages are calculated based upon a 13-week quarter. Inflation rates for 2010 and 2011 were 1.6 percent and 3.2 percent respectively.¹

Limitations

Unemployment insurance records reflect wages earned during a given quarter. These records give no information about the job itself, such as whether it was full-time, part-time, or seasonal. A person might be a part-time employee who has been working seven months, or a full-time employee whose first record in the UI data base appears near the end of the quarter. No attempts were made to extrapolate wages beyond one quarter.

Results

The Iowa Department of Education reviewed records of first-time full-time students who graduated from an Iowa community college in 2009, 2010, or 2011.

Median wages of workers during the fourth quarter of 2009 were \$371.23 per week. In 2010, median wages increased to \$375.76 per week during the same period. By 2011, median wages had increased to \$382.12 per

week, representing an annualized increase of 1.5 percent from 2009. Data published by the U. S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (2012) indicate weekly wages of \$390.00 fell within the tenth percentile for workers holding an Associates degree.

Among Iowa's students who earned an Associates degree, the median wage was \$464.01 per week during the fourth quarter of 2011, down \$161.04 (-2.6 percent) from the same quarter in 2009, but an increase of \$556.11 (10.2 percent) from the same quarter in 2010. This fluctuation in wages may be a reflection of the market correcting itself from the effects of the recession that began in 2007.

Adult Basic Education

A primary focus of Iowa's Adult Basic Education (ABE) program is to help students acquire basic skills so they can earn a high school equivalency diploma, which will subsequently give them access to postsecondary credit education or non-credit training. Iowa's community college ABE programs offer many noncredit training opportunities, including skilled training for occupations in high demand.

Participants of adult basic education programs receive

help setting employment goals. Workforce and basic skills are assessed and program employees work with participants to determine career readiness and skills needed to obtain a job in a desired field. Iowa tracks participants who indicate their intent to secure or retain employment as a goal during the program year.

From 2005 through 2011, 55.9 percent of ABE participants who intended to continue postsecondary education achieved that goal. In 2011, the year for which most recent data are available, 238 students (69.6 percent) continued with postsecondary education. Table 12-20 summarizes this outcome for years 2005-2011.

During this same period, 77.2 percent of ABE participants who intended to enter the workforce achieved that goal, and 84.7 percent met their goal to retain employment. In 2011, 2,849 students (77.2 percent) entered the labor market. Among students who intended to retain employment, 409 (86.1 percent) did so. Table 12-21 summarizes these outcomes for years 2005-2011.

Tuition AND FEES

Iowa's Community Colleges Resident Tuition

Table 13-1 lists the average tuition, lowest tuition, and highest tuition charged at Iowa's community colleges for a full-time resident student. Iowa Code limits the total tuition for Iowa residents attending community colleges so as not to exceed the lowest tuition rate per semester charged by a public university for a full-time resident student. A full-time student in this report is a student who enrolls in 15 credit hours.

Average tuition increased \$1,526 from fiscal year 2004

to fiscal year 2013, an increase of 60 percent. Tuition gains averaged 5.31 percent each year.

The spread between tuition amounts has increased since 2004. The difference from the highest annual tuition to lowest annual tuition has increased from \$390 in fiscal year 2004 to \$742 in fiscal year 2013. As a percentage of the average tuition, this variance has increased from 15 percent in 2004 to over 18 percent in 2013.

Table 13-11 lists the full-time resident tuition by college for arts and sciences and career and technical education (CTE) programs.



The tuition per credit hour is shown in Table 13-2. Over the past 10 years, the average tuition cost per credit hour has increased from \$85.69 to \$136.56 per credit hour. Courses generally range from three to five credit hours in a community college.

Similar to average tuition, the variance between the community colleges has increased. The difference between the highest per credit hour rate and lowest per credit hour rate increased from \$13 in fiscal year 2004 to \$24.75 in fiscal year 2013. Tables 13-11 and 13-12 list tuition per credit hour by college.

Iowa's Community Colleges Mandatory Fees

Table 13-3 reflects the basic mandatory fees charged at each community college; however, this is not an all–inclusive list of fees charged by the individual community colleges. Some colleges do not charge separate fees in addition to their tuition charge. Moreover, these fees do not include any program specific fees.


In fiscal year 2013, average fees will increase \$.60 to \$339.69. Average mandatory tuition fees have grown 3.24 percent per year since fiscal year 2004.

Tuition and Mandatory Fees Per Credit Hour

Figure 13-4 shows tuition and mandatory fees per credit hour. Notwithstanding additional fees, this represents the cost of enrolling in a community college. The average tuition and mandatory fees charged per credit hour will increase \$4.98 per hour in fiscal 2013 to \$147.90. This is a 3.48 percent increase from the previous year. See Table 13-11 for a listing of individual tuition and fees charged by each community college.




Figure 13-3: Annual Iowa Community Colleges Full-Time Mandatory Fees

National Comparison of Tuition and Fees

The following information uses data from The Chronicle of Higher Education, Almanac Issue 2011-2012. This report provides data through 2010, which is the most recent national higher education tuition data available. The information will differ from the previous section as the Chronicle data is based on information supplied to the U.S. Department of Education and includes student fees. Iowa Department of Education tables are based on information provided and verified by Iowa's community

colleges to the Iowa Department of Education.




Figure 13-6: National Comparison of Tuition and Fees

From fiscal year 2003 to fiscal year 2010, average tuition at Iowa's community colleges increased 55 percent while the national average increased 39 percent (see Table 13-5, Figures 13-5 and 13-6). Tuition and fees are still 56 percent above the national average.


Iowa has the third highest tuition and fees level of its contiguous states (see Table 13-6). Minnesota and South Dakota continue to have the highest average tuition rates in this region. Iowa has the second smallest percentage change in tuition and fees from 2003-2010.

Tuition Comparison with Iowa's Public Universities

Tables 13-7 through 13-9 provide a comparison of Iowa's community colleges average annual full-time resident tuition rate to the average tuition rate of Iowa's public universities. By law, community college tuition cannot exceed the minimum tuition at the public universities. In 2013, community college tuition will be 38 percent lower than the public university average tuition.


Iowa's public universities increased tuition 3.76 percent in fiscal year 2013 compared to the 3.77 percent gain for Iowa community colleges.






FINANCIAL AID

Iowa community college students receive financial aid from federal, state, institutional, and other sources. Student financial aid includes grants, scholarships, and loans. The Chronicle of Higher Education Almanac issue 2012-2013 reports that in fiscal year 2011, the state of Iowa spent a total of \$54,364,000 on student aid for needbased students, \$3,485,000 on student aid for non-need based students, and \$1,238,000 on non-grant student aid.

In analyzing aid by source to the community colleges from the Iowa College Student Aid Commission, federal aid was \$489,012,519, state aid was \$6,272,339, institutional aid was \$14,472,564, and other aid was \$9,842,949.

The breakdown of community college financial aid shows that in 2012, 94 percent of all aid was from federal sources, three percent was from community colleges, two percent from other aid sources, and one percent from the state of Iowa.


15 FINANCIAL

The total Fund 1 unrestricted general fund revenues increased \$5,659,354 in fiscal year (FY) 2012 from the prior year. This represented a one percent increase in nominal terms. This increase in revenue consisted, in part, from a 1.9 percent increase in tuition and fees, a 4.2 percent increase in local revenue, and a 3.1 percent

increase in state general aid (SGA). Other income decreased 6.7 percent. Federal support showed a 29.9 percent decrease.

Tuition and fees (57.8 percent) was the largest source of revenue for the community colleges with state seneral sid (SGA) following at 30.1 percent. Local and federal



Figure 15-2: State General Aid as Percent of Revenue: 2008-2012





sources of revenue were 4.9 and 1.9 percent, respectively. Total revenues, adjusted to 2012 dollars, have shown an overall decrease of 1.8 percent from the previous year. In real terms, tuition and fees revenue decreased .9 percent from 2011 and state general aid increased .2 percent. From 2008 through 2012, total revenue has increased

tuition and fees revenue has shown a real dollar increase of 32.8 percent and SGA has decreased 11.3 percent. Local revenue has increased 12.4 percent in real dollars, and federal support has decreased 19.3 percent. Other revenue has decreased by 29.4 percent.

Unrestricted General Fund Expenditures by Source

The total Unrestricted General Fund Expenditures in fiscal year 2012 increased \$12,178,026 from the previous year in nominal terms. This represented a 2.3 percent increase. The increase in expenditures included a 3.7 percent increase in salaries and benefits, a 1.3 percent increase in current expenses, and a 2.1 percent increase in materials, supplies, and travel. Service expenses decreased 2.6 percent and capital outlays were down 27.5 percent.

Total Unrestricted General Fund Expenditures, adjusted to 2012 dollars, decreased 0.6 percent in 2011 in real dollars. Salaries showed a slight increase of 0.8 percent in real dollars while service expenses (-5.3), materials, supplies and travel (-.7), current expenses (-1.6), and capital outlays (-29.5) all showed real dollar decreases.

From 2008 through 2012, using adjusted dollar amounts, salary expenditures have increased 8.8 percent, service expenditures has increased 7.9 percent. Capital outlays have increased 4.8 percent. Materials, supplies, and travel expenses have increased 1.7 percent since 2008. The services categories are defined below:

- 1. Salaries all salaries paid by the community college including administrative, instructional, professional, secretarial and clerical, and service staff. Includes other payroll costs such as fringe benefits and worker's compensation insurance.

 2. Services items such as professional fees, memberships, publications, rental of materials, buildings and equipment, and insurance.
- 3. Materials, Supplies, and Travel expenses such as materials and supplies, periodicals, vehicle materials and supplies, and travel expenses.
- 4. Current Expenses items such as purchase for resale, payment on debt principal, student compensation, and transfers.
- 5. Capital Outlay items such as furniture, machinery, and equipment, lease purchase equipment, vehicles, land, buildings and fixed equipment, and other structures and improvements.

Unrestricted General Fund Expenditures by Function

Total Unrestricted General Fund expenditures in arts and sciences, adjusted to 2012 dollars, increased .7 percent from fiscal year 2011. Adult Education expenditures increased 4.3 percent in real dollars and cooperative programs/services increased 13.4 percent. Administration expenditures increased 3.9 percent and student services spending increased 5.6 percent in real terms. Vocational Tech decreased 1.5 percent and learning resources (-9.6), physical plant -8.8), and general institution (-3) expenses all declined in real dollars.

From 2008 through 2012, in 2012 dollars, the arts and sciences function experienced a 18.7 percent increase in expenditures, the vocational/technical function a 5.4 percent increase, the administration function a 19 percent increase, the physical plant a 3.3 percent increase, general institution expenses increased 11 percent, and student services a 11.8 percent increase. In contrast, adult education expenditures decreased 1.2 percent, learning resources expenditures decreased 13.3 percent, and cooperative program expenses decreased 5.3 percent since FY 2008.

The arts and sciences function continues to be the largest source of expenditures in fiscal year 2012 at 24.9 percent. This function is followed by the vocational/technical function at 24 percent. The physical plant function was 10.7 percent, the general institution expenses were 12.8 percent, adult education was 8.2 percent, learning resources was 2.1 percent, student services was 8.9 percent, cooperative programs was 1.6 percent, and the administration function was 6.5 percent of the total expenditures in fiscal year 2012.

The function categories are defined below: Arts and Sciences – all administrative and instructional organizational units of the community college that provide instruction in the area of college parallel and career option/college parallel (CO/CP).

<u>Career/Vocational Technical</u> – all organizational units designed to provide vocational, technical, and semi-professional training.

Adult Education – all organizational units designed to

provide services, courses, and programs intended mainly for part-time students who are not a part of one of the instructional divisions of arts and sciences or career/vocational technical functions. Some examples include Adult Basic Education (ABE), high school completion, and short-term preparatory.

<u>Cooperative Programs or Services</u> – all organizational units designed to provide instruction for secondary joint effort activities and all activities concerning Chapter 260E Industrial New Jobs Training and Chapter 260F Jobs Training.

Administration – all expenses of the Community College Board of Trustees, the CEO, and business office, which serves the entire community college.

<u>Student Services</u> – all organizational units, which are primarily concerned with providing services for students.

<u>Learning Resources</u> – all organizational units, which provide for storage, distribution, and use of educational materials throughout the entire community college.

<u>Physical Plant</u> – all organizational units, which are responsible for the operation and maintenance of the community college's physical facilities.

<u>General Institution</u> – all other expenses except those included in the above functions. Some examples include institutional development, data processing, general printing, communication, alumni affairs, early retirement, and telecommunications.

Unrestricted General Fund Revenues vs. Expenditures

After adjusting for inflation (using 2012 dollars), total revenue decreased by 1.8 percent from fiscal year 2011 to fiscal year 2012 and total expenditures decreased by .6 percent. Since fiscal year 2008, both Unrestricted General Fund revenues and Unrestricted General Fund expenditures have grown nine percent.

Full-Time Equivalent Enrollment (FTEE)

The Full-Time Equivalent Enrollment (FTEE) calculation is utilized when determining SGA. Due to timing of

the calculation to meet Iowa Legislative deadlines, the enrollment used to calculate SGA is two years behind the year of the aid (i.e., fiscal year 2012 enrollments are used to calculate fiscal year 2014 SGA). Twenty-four (24) credit semester hours equals one FTEE, while 600 non-credit contact hours equals one FTEE.

Until fiscal year 2012, FTEE totals have been increasing from fiscal year 2008 through fiscal year 2011. However fiscal year 2012 saw a decrease of 4,747 FTEE.

This represented a 4.4 percent decrease from the previous year.

State General Aid (SGA)

The fiscal year 2012 SGA amount was \$163,774,647. This amount represented an increase of \$5,020,415, or 3.2% over the previous year. After adjusting previous SGA amounts into 2012 dollars, the SGA has decreased 5.3 percent in real dollars since fiscal year 2003.

Unrestricted General Fund Revenue and Expenditure per FTEE

Unrestricted General Fund revenue per FTEE, after adjusting to 2012 dollars, indicates that overall amounts of revenue per FTEE have decreased 4.8 percent from FY 2008 through FY 2012. Fiscal year 2012 revenue per FTEE was 2.7 percent more than fiscal year 2011. This increase in revenue per FTEE is due in large part to the fact that the overall FTEE number decreased in fiscal year 2012.

The Unrestricted General Fund expenditures per FTEE, after adjusting to 2012 dollars, show that the total per FTEE has decreased 4.8 percent since fiscal year 2008. The fiscal year 2012 expenditure per FTEE amount increased 4.0 percent from the previous year. This increase in expenditures per FTEE is also due in large part to the overall decrease in FTEE in fiscal year 2012.



the SGA per FTEE amount increased in fiscal year 2012 by 4.9 percent compared to the previous year.

Utilizing SGA information adjusted into 2012 dollars, the SGA amount per FTEE has been steadily declining since 2003. In the past ten years, the amount dropped from \$2,046 per FTEE in 2003 to \$1,599 per FTEE in 2012. This represents a decrease of 21.9 percent during this time. Due to the drop in FTEE in fiscal year 2012,



HUMAN RESOURCES


During fiscal year (FY) 2012, Iowa community colleges had 14,018 employees, which included administrative, instructional, professional, secretarial and clerical, and service positions. Some employees were included in more than one reporting category; for example, an administrator who might also teach a course. Thus, there were 15,631 full-time, part-time, temporary, and adjunct positions reported in 2012. The Community College Management Information System (MIS) data does not include employees teaching only non-credit courses for community colleges, unless they are full-time non-credit instructors.

While the total number of employees increased by 1.8 percent from 2012, the professional composition of community college employees has remained relatively the same for the past seven years. The largest group was instructional (50.1%), followed by professional (23.1%), secretarial and clerical (14.7%), service (11.2%), and administrative (0.9%). Before 2005, secretarial and clerical staff outnumbered professional staff (Figure 16-1).

COMMUNITY COLLEGE EMPLOYEES

The distribution by the type of employment also demonstrated relative stability throughout 12 years since the tracking began. One deviation from the stable pattern in 2012 was that adjuncts (34.9% of all employees) slightly outnumbered full-time employees (34.7% of all employees), for the second time in the MIS history. Number of positions for temporary/seasonal staff demonstrated dramatic change in 2008, from 542 to 1,990 employees — a 353 percent increase, peaked in 2010 and slightly declined in 2012 (Figure 16-2).

Figure 16-2: Employment by Type: 2000-2012



Employee Education and Demographics

Iowa community college instructors and administrators have continuously improved their education. The number of instructors and administrators with doctoral degrees demonstrated a steady growth between 2004 and 2011, from 201 to 244 (18%), but dropped to 234 in 2012. Before 2006, the numbers for master's degree or higher fluctuated between 49 percent and 64 percent, but since 2006 they slowly grew to a record high 64.9 percent in 2010. Even though in 2011 this number dropped back to 63.3 percent, it grew to 63.6 percent in 2012. The number of bachelor's degree instructors and administrators remains stable for the past five years, as well as the number of associate degree holders: both categories show fluctuations within one percent range (Figure 16-3).

The percent of racial/ethnic minorities grew between 2011 and 2012 from 7 to 7.3, and the 13-year comparison


demonstrated a steady increase in the number of racial/ ethnic minorities among Iowa community college employees. The average growth between 2000 and 2012 was 5.9 percent (Figure 16-4).

The distribution within the racial minorities was not as linear. The percentage of American Indians fluctuated between 6.4 (FY 2000) and record low 3.9 in FY 2012; Asians demonstrated increases and declines, and their number dropped to a record low 18.7 percent in FY 2012; Blacks showed close to three percent decline in FY 2012 compared to FY 2011, and only Hispanics grew from 27.5 to 28.6 percent between FY 2011 and FY 2012. Since FY 2010, when the new standards allowed reporting of more than one race, the cohort of more than one race representatives grew from three percent in FY 2010, to four percent in FY 2011, to record high 8.5 percent in FY 2012 (Figure 16-5).

A typical community college instructor, as in prior years, was female, 47.9 years of age, and white.


Figure 16-6: Gender Distribution of Employees: 2000-2012

Gender composition of Iowa community college employees remained stable. In 2000, the females composed close to 58 percent, and in 2012 they were 59.1 percent of all employees (Figure 16-6).

In 2012, the age distribution of Iowa community college employees presented a wide palette of groups, from teen years to early eighties. The largest groups were among those between 19-20 and 46-61, peaking at 58. Together, these two groups represent over 42 percent of all community college employees. The average age of community college employees was 44 years old, and the median age was 46 years-old (Figure 16-7).

Distributed among seven age groups, from under 17 to over 55, the largest group of employees in 2012 was between 40-55 years old. The fastest growing group,


however, was over 55 years old. From 2008 to 2012, that group grew 4.9 percent on average (Tables 16-18 through 16-22).

The largest group of community college administrators was between 53 and 57 years old. The average age of administrators was 53 years old and the median age was 54 years old (Figure 16-7).

Iowa community college full-time instructional staff was presented by all ages between 24 and 75. The largest group was between 45 and 61, peaking at 58. The average age of community college full-time instructors was 49.5 years, and the median age was 51 (Figure 16-8).


The most recent data from the U.S. Education Department showed that 66.1 percent of the nation's community college faculty were between the ages of 45

and 64. The percentage of Iowa community college full-time faculty in the same age group was smaller than the nationwide average of 63.3 percent in 2011. The average age of Iowa community college full-time

faculty increased from 49.6 in 2010 to 50.1 in 2011, and decreased to 49.5 in 2012, discontinuing the trend since 2004. The median age has also slightly decreased from 51.5 to 51 (Figure 16-8).


Employee Salaries


Figure 16-9: Average and Median Age of Full-Time Instructors: 2005-2012


Figure 16-10: Average Base Salary of **Full-Time Instructors: 2001-2012**

The average base salary for a nine-month contract for full-time instructional employees increased from \$52,350 in fiscal year 2011 to \$55,601 in fiscal year 2012. The average increase of full-time instructional staff salaries since 2001 was 3.2 percent (Figures 16-9 and 16-10). In addition to the MIS, there are a number of other state and

federal reports that publish faculty salaries; variances across those reports are due to differences in factors (i.e., definitions, classification systems, and contract periods). For example, the National Center for Educational Statistics (NCES) published \$57,677 as an average salary of full-time instructors* in two-year institutions based on nine-month contracts in fiscal year 2012.



annual numbers for colleges nationwide and by state. According to those numbers, Iowa community college instructors were paid on average 92.7 percent of the national average salary for two-year public institutions in fiscal year 2011 (latest available data). Based on the data from 1996 through 2011, the average salary steadily increased for Iowa full-time community college

instructors; in 2011, the increase was 0.7 percent, while the average salary increase nationally was only 0.3 percent (Figure 16-11). Iowa 13-year average demonstrated an increase of 3.4 percent since 1996, while the national average increased only 2.4 percent during the same time period.
