**Iowa Community College Fall 2005
Credit Student Enrollment Report**

Iowa Community Colleges transmit fall enrollment data to the Department of Education after the 14th day of the fall term start date. All data included in this report, except where noted, are taken from the Management Information System (MIS) electronic data files and are confirmed by the community college.

Fall 2005 Iowa Community College Credit Enrollment

Fall 2005 unduplicated credit headcount enrollment of 82,499 demonstrates an increase of 696 (0.85%) over Fall 2004 unduplicated credit headcount enrollment of 81,803. The majority (57.14%) of Fall 2005 enrollees continued enrollment from the previous fiscal year. See Table 1.

Fall 2005 credit hours equaled 794,592 hours, demonstrating a decrease of 3,100.39 credit hours (0.39%) over Fall 2004 credit hours of 797,692.39. See Table 3.





Age of Enrollees: Approximately sixty-seven percent (66.63%) of the total credit enrollment is 22 years or less, with 21.32 percent 17 years of age or under. The age distribution is shown in Table 5. Table 6 shows Fall 2005 credit enrollee's average age of 23.25 continued a 5-year decline in average age.


Ethnicity of Enrollees: As shown in Table 7 below, minority enrollments at Iowa's Community Colleges comprise 10.05 percent of the total enrollees that reported ethnicity. According to the 2000 census 7.4 percent of the general population in Iowa were minorities. Table 7 further indicates minority enrollments at Iowa's Community Colleges continue to grow from 9.29 percent of the reporting population in Fall 2004 to 10.05 percent in Fall 2005.

Total Enrollment by Program Type: Community college fall credit enrollment continues to grow, with approximately 57 percent (57.22%) pursuing Arts and Science programs (see Figure 3). Arts and Science program enrollment increased 1,342 (2.27%) from Fall 2004 to Fall 2005. Career Option programs decreased 177 (-3.21%) from Fall 2004 to Fall 2005. Career Technical enrollment decreased 1,082 (-3.57%) over the same time period. Some of this decrease could be accounted for with students enrolled in a combination of program types, which grew 613 (454.07%) during that time.


