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# **Executive Summary**

The Iowa Department of Education collects information on joint enrollment in Iowa's 15 community colleges. Jointly enrolled students are high school students enrolled in community college credit coursework. Most jointly enrolled students enroll through Senior Year Plus (SYP) programs such as Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) and concurrent enrollment. Other students enroll independently by paying tuition or enrolling in courses delivered through contractual agreements that do not meet the definition of concurrent enrollment. For more information about SYP programs, please refer to the department's website.

This report consists of fiscal year and trend data on joint enrollment, including headcount enrollment, credit hours, student demographics, and enrollment by program type and offering arrangement. All data included in this report is taken from the Community College Management Information System (MIS) and confirmed by each college, unless otherwise noted.

Some of the highlights of this report include:

- Enrollment increased from 38,892 in 2011 to 39,570 in 2012 (Table 1).
- Year-to-year growth was 1.7 percent. Average annual growth over the last five years was 5.9 percent (Table 1). Eleven community colleges experienced increased enrollments: four experienced declines.
- Jointly enrolled students accounted for 25.9 percent of total community college enrollment (Figure 2). About half of these jointly enrolled students were seniors, and about one-third were juniors (Figure 8).
- Joint enrollment accounts for 13.8 percent of total credit hours (Figure 3).
- Most students (87.5 percent) enrolled through courses delivered through a contractual agreement between a community college and school district (Table 4).
- 10% of students enrolled through postsecondary PSEO courses (Table 4).
- Approximately half of joint enrollees were female, a lower proportion than the total student body (Figure 6).
- Approximately 10 percent of joint enrollees had a minority racial or ethnic background, a lower proportion than the total student body (Figure 7).
- The most common subject areas among jointly enrolled students were English language and literature, social sciences and history, and mathematics, followed by foreign language and literature and various career and technical disciplines.

### **About this Report:**

This report summarizes joint enrollment in Iowa's community colleges. Jointly enrolled students are high school students enrolled in community college credit coursework. This report contains fiscal year data for the state's 15 community colleges reported through the Community College Management Information System (MIS) and confirmed by each college.

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# **Joint Enrollment**

Each year, tens of thousands of Iowa high school students enroll in community college credit coursework. The Department of Education refers to these students as "jointly enrolled."

Joint enrollment of high school students accounts for more than a quarter of total community college credit enrollment and more than an eighth of total credit hours. Iowa is one of at least 46 states with statewide dual enrollment policies (Education Commission of the States, 2012). In Iowa, high school students enroll in community college credit courses in a variety of ways including through Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) courses, college courses offered through a contract between a local school district and a community college, and enrollment in a college course independently as a tuition-paying student.

While sometimes still referred to as "dual credit," joint enrollment does not necessarily entail credit being issued at both the secondary and postsecondary levels. Some programs, such as PSEO and concurrent enrollment, require that credit be issued at each level, while other joint enrollment opportunities have no such requirement.

Most joint enrollment opportunities fall under the rubric of Senior Year Plus. This legislation, passed in 2008, consolidated and standardized several existing programs involving college credit opportunities for high school students including PSEO, concurrent enrollment (which entails supplementary weighting for local school districts), career and regional academies, and advanced placement. The Community College MIS captures

joint enrollment in three categories — PSEO, contracted courses (which may or may not be concurrent enrollment and generate supplementary weighting for the partnering local district), and tuition.

Joint enrollment in Iowa community colleges has risen to a record high of 39,570 unduplicated students in fiscal year 2012 (Figure 1, Table 1). In fiscal year 2012, jointly enrolled students accounted for 25.9 percent of total enrollment (Figure 2). Since fiscal year 2008, joint enrollment has increased 25.8 percent or about 5.9 percent per year. Fiscal year 2012 had slower growth (1.7 percent) than the five-year average.

Figure 1 – Joint Enrollment (Headcount), by College: 2008-2012



Enrollment growth of jointly enrolled students increased 1.7 percent, which contrasted with the 1.7 percent decline in total credit enrollment. Enrollment increased at 11 community colleges and declined at four.

The number of credit hours taken by each jointly enrolled student remained unchanged from fiscal year 2011 with each jointly enrolled student enrolling in an average of 7.7 credit hours (Figure 4). The number of credit hours taken per jointly enrolled student has increased 0.2 credit hour since fiscal year 2008. Special analysis in 2008 showed that jointly enrolled students take slightly less than three classes on average. Because high school students generally enroll part-time, they account for a smaller percentage of total credit hours than total enrollment (Figure 3). In fiscal year 2012, joint enrollment accounted for 13.8 percent of total credit hours.

The rate at which high school students enroll in community college coursework varies by local school district and community college region (Figure 10).

In fiscal year 2012, Des Moines Area Community College had the largest percentage of total enrollment and total credit hours jointly enrolled (Figures 2, 3). Kirkwood Community College continued to have the smallest percentage of enrollment and credit hours jointly enrolled. Statewide, 25.9 percent of community college students were jointly enrolled in 2012 and accounted for 13.9 percent of all credit hours delivered. Des Moines Area Community College had the largest number of jointly enrolled students and credit hours.

Nationally, public two-year colleges offer college credit coursework to high school students at higher rates than other sectors of higher education (Kleiner and Lewis, 2005). In 2005, 98 percent of public two-year colleges nationwide had high school students jointly enrolled in college credit coursework compared with 77 of public four-year institutions. In Iowa, delivery of programming to high school students is a part of the community colleges' mission (Iowa Code 260C.1) and, consequently, all 15 community colleges are committed to offering college credit opportunities to these students.

Figure 2 – Joint Enrollment as a Percentage of All Students, by College: 2012




### **Joint Enrollment Offering Arrangements**




Figure 5 – Joint Enrollment by Offering Arrangement, by College: 2012

Contracted courses had the largest enrollment of the three types of joint enrollment offering arrangements accounting for 91.0 percent of jointly enrolled students in fiscal year 2012 (Figure 5, Table 4). Enrollment in contracted courses rose 3.0 percent from the previous year to 36,014 students. PSEO, which accounts for 9.9 percent of joint enrollment, fell 7.2 percent from fiscal year 2011. Enrollment of tuition-paying students declined 15.7 percent from the previous year.

### **Jointly Enrolled Student Demographics**

The typical jointly enrolled community college student, as with prior years, is female, 17 years old, and Caucasian. Compared with the overall student body, jointly enrolled students are proportionally more white and male. In fiscal year 2012, approximately 50.1 percent of joint enrollees were female compared with 55.9 percent of the overall student body (Figure 6). The phenomenon of proportionally greater male enrollment is

driven by contracted course enrollment, which was 51.2 percent male in fiscal year 2012. In terms of gender, contracted course enrollment more closely mirrors high school enrollment than community college enrollment. In contrast, PSEO and tuition enrollment were 36.0 percent and 35.5 percent male respectively.




Figure 7 – Jointly Enrolled Student Racial and Ethnic Background: 2012

In fiscal year 2012, approximately 21 percent of joint enrollees reported having a minority racial or ethnic background. Tuition course enrollment had the largest proportion of minority students (12.3 percent) followed by contracted (10.0 percent) and PSEO (4.2 percent). Hispanics were the largest minority group with 43.1 percent of minority joint enrollment followed by Black and Asian students with 20.4 percent and 18.4 percent respectively (Figure 7). In fiscal year 2012, by comparison, 16.8 percent of all community college students reported having a minority racial or ethnic background, 23.6 percent of whom were Black and 16.3 percent of whom were Hispanic.

As expected, jointly enrolled students were younger than the overall community college student body, but very few were younger than age 17 (about 18.5 percent). More than 76.8 percent of jointly enrolled students were age 17 or 18.

Figure 4 – Credit Hours Per Student, by College: 2012



Figure 6 – Jointly Enrolled Student Gender, by College: 2012





Figure 8 – Jointly Enrolled Student High School Grade Level: 2012

Jointly enrolled students were almost exclusively residents of Iowa. In fiscal year 2012, 99.5 percent of jointly enrolled students were from Iowa.

### **Grade Level of Jointly Enrolled Students**

Jointly enrolled students tend to be high school upper class students and, in particular, seniors. Almost 84 percent of jointly enrolled students were in their last two years of high school (Figure 8). Slightly over half the students were seniors and about a third were juniors. Almost 11 percent of jointly enrolled students were sophomores in high school and 5.6 percent were freshmen. In total, 25.2 percent of students in grades 9-12 enrolled in a community college credit course including more than half of all seniors. Data on grade level is derived through a match between the state's K-12 data repository and the Community College MIS. Figure 9 displays the distribution of high school students enrolled in Iowa community colleges during fiscal year 2012.

# Concurrent Enrollment and PSEO by Subject Area

Unlike other sections of this report, which utilize Community College MIS data, this section is based on Basic Education Data System (BEDS) data. The department analyzed data on the instances of concurrent enrollment and PSEO courses taken by subject area. Courses taken by tuition-paying students enrolling independent of the district were not included.

Of PSEO courses taken, 40.5 percent were in the subject area of Social Sciences & History (Table 5). English Language & Literature courses accounted for an additional 16.0 percent of courses taken.


Of concurrent enrollment courses taken, career and technical education disciplines account for a greater share of courses taken (Table 6). The subject area with the greatest instances of courses taken was English Language & Literature, followed by Social Sciences & History, and Mathematics courses. Of career and technical education subject areas, Health Care Sciences and Computer & Information Sciences and had the largest number of instances of courses taken.





# Joint Enrollment and Total Enrollment: 2008-2012






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

### Joint Enrollment and Total Enrollment: 2008-2012





### Joint Enrollment and Total Enrollment: 2008-2012








