High School Enrollment Report

Fiscal Year 2007

The 2007 Iowa Community College High School Enrollment Report consists of fiscal year and trend data on high school student credit enrollment in the state's 15 community colleges. The report includes system-wide and college-level enrollment data including headcount enrollment, credit hours, student demographics, and enrollment by program type. Iowa's 15 community colleges transmit fiscal year enrollment data to the Iowa Department of Education annually. All data included in this report, except where noted, are taken from the Community College Management Information System (MIS) electronic data files and are confirmed by each college.

High School Enrollment vs. Total Enrollment

High school student enrollment in Iowa community colleges comprised 25.61% of the total community college enrollment in Fiscal Year 2007. This ranged from a low of 11.49% of the student population at Kirkwood Community College to a high of 44.06% at Iowa Central Community College. In other words, Iowa Cen-


tral had the largest percentage of its student population comprised of high school students (See Figure 1).

High school students enrolled in only 12.29% of the total credit hours provided by Iowa community colleges in Fiscal Year 2007. This ranged from a low of 4.46% at Kirk-

wood to a high of 22.21% at Iowa Central (See Figure 2).

High school students enrolled in approximately half the average credit hours (7.47 credit hours) compared to the total student population (14.53 credit hours) (See Table 1).

Figure 2— Credit Hours Taken by High School Students as a Percentage of Total Credit Hours, by Iowa Community College, Fiscal Year 2007



High School Credit Enrollment and Credit Hours

During Fiscal Year 2007, credit headcount enrollment (unduplicated) included 30,099 high school students taking courses for postsecondary credit. Each community college's share of the total statewide high school enrollment ranges from a low of 1.75% at Southwestern Community College to a high of 28.73% at Des Moines Area Community College (DMACC). In other words, almost a third of all high school students enrolled in community college credit courses during Fiscal Year 2007 were enrolled at DMACC. High school students earned 224,984.95 credit hours during Fiscal Year 2007. High school students enrolled in college coursework earned an average of 7.47 credits; this compares with an average of 14.53 credits for all community college students (See Table 2).

The majority (73.77%) of high school students enrolled in college credit coursework were enrolled in Arts and

Science programs in Fiscal Year 2007. Career and Technical programs served


24.88% of the high school enrollment (See Table 3 and Figure 3).

Gender of High School Enrollees

The majority of community college high school enrollees were female (51.6%) in Fiscal Year 2007 (see Table 4 and Figure 4).

Figure 4 — Gender of High School Enrollees, Fiscal Year 2007



Racial/Ethnic Background of Enrollees

As shown in Table 5, enrollees that were members of minority racial/ethnic groups comprised 7.72% of the total high school enrollees that reported racial/ethnic background. The percentage of high school enrollees with minority racial/ethnic backgrounds is lower than for the total credit student population (10.55% were members of minority racial/ethnic groups). According to 2006 Census estimates, 9% of the general population in Iowa were members of a minority racial/ethnic group.

High School Student Enrollment Trends

To enhance the detail and improve the accuracy of high school college credit enrollment data, the Iowa Department of Education revised reporting standards for Fiscal Year 2007. Prior to Fiscal Year 2007, high school students identified and reported themselves to colleges. For Fiscal Year 2007, a new data element was added to the Management Information System (MIS) to identify the funding source for the high school enrollment. These changes to reporting standards limit comparisons between Fiscal Year 2007 and previous reporting years.


Since the Department began tracking high school students enrolled for postsecondary credit at Iowa community colleges in 2002, the growth in enrollment has been significant (See Table 6 and Figure 5).

Figure 5 — High School Enrollment as a Proportion of Total Enrollment, Fiscal Year 2003 to Fiscal Year 2007





Description of Program Types

Arts and Sciences — College parallel programs leading to an Associate of Arts (AA), Associate of Science (AS). The programs are designed for students intending to transfer and obtain a baccalaureate degree. The AS and AA degrees prepare students to enter a four-year college or university as a junior.

Career and Technical — College credit programs leading to a certificate, diploma, Associate of Applied Arts (AAA), or Associate of Applied Studies (AAS) degree. Career and Technical programs are designed to provide the specific skills and knowledge essential for successful entry into a specific or related occupation requiring less than a baccalaureate degree or for further education.

College Parallel/Career Option— Associate of Science credit degree programs designed as the first two years of transfer credit toward a baccalaureate degree in a specific occupational area and which includes a minimum number of skill development courses for immediate employment. Students are provided a choice of articulating their program to a four-year institution for completion of a baccalaureate degree or seeking immediate employment. The programs are required to transfer to at least three institutions that have a baccalaureate program in the career area.







Northeast Iowa Community College High School and Regular Enrollment, Fiscal Year 2003 to Fiscal Year 2007




Northeast Iowa Community College High School Enrollment, by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2007





North Iowa Area Community College High School and Regular Enrollment, Fiscal Year 2003 to Fiscal Year 2007




North Iowa Area Community College High School Enrollment, by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2007





Iowa Lakes Community College High School and Regular Enrollment, Fiscal Year 2003 to Fiscal Year 2007




Iowa Lakes Community College High School Enrollment, by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2007





Northwest Iowa Community College High School Enrollment, by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2007





Iowa Central Community College High School Enrollment, by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2007





Iowa Valley Community College District High School Enrollment, by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2007





Hawkeye Community College High School and Regular Enrollment, Fiscal Year 2003 to Fiscal Year 2007




Hawkeye Community College High School Enrollment, by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2007







Kirkwood Community College High School Enrollment, by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2007





Des Moines Area Community College High School and Regular Enrollment, Fiscal Year 2003 to Fiscal Year 2007




Des Moines Area Community College High School Enrollment, by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2007







Iowa Western Community College High School and Regular Enrollment, Fiscal Year 2003 to Fiscal Year 2007




Iowa Western Community College High School Enrollment, by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2007





Southwestern Community College High School and Regular Enrollment, Fiscal Year 2003 to Fiscal Year 2007




Southwestern Community College High School Enrollment, by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2007





Indian Hills Community College High School and Regular Enrollment, Fiscal Year 2003 to Fiscal Year 2007




Indian Hills Community College High School Enrollment, by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2007




