Iowa Community College Fiscal Year 2006 High School Enrollment Report

Community Colleges of Iowa transmit fiscal year enrollment data to the Iowa Department of Education. All data included in this report, except where noted, are taken from the Management Information System (MIS) electronic data files and are confirmed by the community college.

High School Enrollment vs. Total Enrollment

High school enrollment comprises 21.01% of the total community college enrollment in fiscal year 2006. This ranges from a low of 7.13% of the student population at Eastern Iowa to a high of 39.12% at Iowa Central. That is, ICCC had the largest percentage of its student population comprised of high school students.

High school students enrolled in only 10.63% of the total credit hours provided by the Community Colleges of Iowa. This ranges from a low of 2.77% at Kirkwood to 22.44% at Iowa Central.

High school students (7.40 credits) take approximately half the average credit hours compared to the total student population (14.63 credits). See Table 1 for detail.

Fiscal Year 2006 High School Enrollment at Iowa Community Colleges

During Fiscal 2006 credit headcount enrollment included 25,578 high school students taking courses for postsecondary credit. Each community college's share of the total statewide high school enrollment ranges from a low of 1.93% at Southwestern Community College to a high of 30.24% at Des Moines Area Community College. In other words, almost one-third of all high school students enrolled in community college credit courses during Fiscal Year 2006 were enrolled at DMACC. High school students earned 189,312.60 credit hours during Fiscal Year 2006. High school students earned an average of 7.40 credits, this compares with a 14.63 average for all community college students. See Table 2.


High School Enrollment by Program Type

A large majority (77.23%) of high school students enrolled in Arts and Sciences programs in Fiscal Year 2006. Career and Technical Education programs served 20.83% of the high school enrollment. (See Table 3 and Figure 1)

by Iowa Community College, Fiscal Year 2006**



Ethnicity of High School Enrollees: As shown in Table 4 below, minority high school enrollments at Iowa’s Community Colleges comprise 7.23% of the total high school enrollees that reported ethnicity; this compares with 9.98% of the overall student population. According to the 2000 census 7.4% of the general population in Iowa was a member of a minority racial/ethnic group.

High School Enrollment Trends:




**Figure 3 - High School Enrollment as a Proportion of Total Enrollment

Since the Department of Education began tracking high school students enrolled for post secondary credit at Iowa Community Colleges in 2002 the growth has been significant. As shown in Table 5 below, high school enrollments at Iowa's Community Colleges have grown 63.62% over the past five fiscal years. High school students made up a larger proportion of the total student population in 2006 (21.01%) than in 2002 (14.79%). See Figure 3.

Fiscal Year 2002 to Fiscal Year 2006**





Fiscal Years 2002-2006**





by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006**





Fiscal Years 2002-2006**





by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006**





Fiscal Years 2002-2006**





by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006**





Fiscal Years 2002-2006**





by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006**





Fiscal Years 2002-2006**





by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006**





Fiscal Years 2002-2006**





by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006**





Hawkeye Community College High School vs Regular Enrollment Fiscal Years 2002-2006




Hawkeye Community College High School Enrollment by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006





Fiscal Years 2002-2006**





by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006**





Fiscal Years 2002-2006**





by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006**





Fiscal Years 2002-2006**





by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006**





Fiscal Years 2002-2006**





by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006**





Iowa Western Community College High School vs Regular Enrollment Fiscal Years 2002-2006




Iowa Western Community College High School Enrollment by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006





Fiscal Years 2002-2006**





by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006**





Fiscal Years 2002-2006**





by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2006**




