Description	<p><i>Pre-requisite: CHAMPS or Discipline in the Secondary Training</i></p> <p><i>Training is intended for: District and building leaders, coaches and teacher leaders.</i></p> <p>The three-day training will be split into two sections, two days back-to-back and one day later. This schedule allows leaders and coaches to take what they learn back into practice immediately. This training will dig deeper into data collection, data analysis, and action steps.</p> <p>Coaching CHAMPS training provides detailed guidance on building a schoolwide program to implement proven, research-based classroom management practices. A formalized structure for collaborative coaching clears the path for administrators and nonevaluative coaches to support teachers in creating calm, orderly, and positive classrooms.</p> <p>Coaching CHAMPS is designed to close the gap between the ideal of research-based practices and the actual implementation of positive classroom management.</p> <p>Drawing on what we know about effective support for students, Coaching CHAMPS training offers a comprehensive guide to supporting teachers in using effective behavior management practices. Through a structured, tiered coaching model, Coaching CHAMPS training empowers schools to more effectively bridge professional development and real-world classroom success. By offering a clear framework rooted in research and aligned with MTSS principles, it equips administrators and coaches to provide differentiated support that meets the unique needs of every teacher. Description	<p><i>Training is intended for: District and building leaders, K-12 classroom teachers, coaches and support staff.</i></p> <p>At its heart, the CHAMPS/DSC approach is designed to help teachers create and implement a classroom management plan that is proactive, positive, and instructional. Using practical strategies that set the stage for appropriate behavior, the teacher can focus on maintaining positive interactions. Students become more motivated and engaged in the classroom. This process improves the classroom dynamics by building a strong sense of classroom community.</p> <p>Through CHAMPS/DSC training, teachers learn to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create a desired classroom culture and environment • Organize their classroom effectively • Identify and teach expectations • Learn effective supervision • Improve student motivation through positive interactions • Correct in a calm, consistent, and concise manner

Description	<p>Early-Stage Interventions help teachers <i>start strong</i>, intervene early with approachable tools, and reserve more intensive support for when early attempts don't work.</p> <p>Attendees will learn to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plan and implement a sequence of simple classroom interventions to address an individual student's chronic misbehavior • Collect data to determine the scope of a problem and assess the effectiveness of interventions • Identify and improve classroom management issues that may be contributing to student misbehavior • Consider academic issues that may play a role in student misbehavior • Address problem behavior in its early stages so a school's Tier 2 and 3 resources can be focused on the most difficult problems <p>Teachers and other staff report the following outcomes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create and maintain productive, respectful learning environments. • Respond effectively to behavior, discipline, and motivation problems. • Develop a repertoire of evidence-based strategies such as planned discussion, using reinforcement, responding consistently to inappropriate behavior, setting goals, and so on. • Learn to collect data to ensure that the function of the behavior is identified and that results of intervention can be evaluated objectively.

Description	<p><i>Training is intended for: K-8 District and building leaders, classroom teachers, coaches and support staff.</i></p> <p>Featuring content from William R. Jenson, this professional development is designed to provide ready-to-use, classroom-tested materials to help motivate and manage students. This training focuses on providing practical, proven strategies to help difficult students manage their behavioral excesses and deficits and learn appropriate behaviors. Minimize student disruptions and maximize learning for all.</p> <p>Training covers practical, evidence-based strategies for dealing effectively with challenging problems like:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Arguing • Aggression toward staff and other students • Noncompliance • Lack of motivation • Poor academic performance <p>Staff will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What causes challenging behavior • How to practically assess it • How to implement proactive strategies to remediate these behaviors <p>This training focuses on the 1-3 students in your classroom who are pushing up against Tier 2 and have behavior excesses such as noncompliance, as well as have behavior and social deficits. It will walk you through using antecedent and motivational strategies to challenge behaviors and, lastly, "reductive techniques" (corrections) that are effective for them.</p> <p>The training provides deeper insight and a broader toolkit for educators dealing with more complex behavioral issues or when early interventions are insufficient.</p>
