

# JOINT ENROLLMENT REPORT 2013



**Community Colleges**

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## Executive Summary

The Iowa Department of Education collects information on joint enrollment in Iowa's 15 community colleges. Jointly enrolled students are high school students enrolled in community college credit coursework. Most jointly enrolled students enroll through Senior Year Plus (SYP) programs such as Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) and concurrent enrollment. Other students enroll independently by paying tuition or enrolling in courses delivered through contractual agreements that do not meet the definition of concurrent enrollment. This report consists of fiscal year and trend data on joint enrollment, including headcount enrollment, credit hours, student demographics, and enrollment by program type and offering arrangement. All data included in this report is taken from the Community College Management Information System (MIS) and confirmed by each college, unless otherwise noted.

Some of the highlights of this report include:

- Enrollment increased from 39,570 students last year to 40,262 this year.
- Year-to-year growth was 1.7 percent. Average annual growth over the last five years was 1.8 percent. Ten community colleges experienced increased enrollments: five experienced declines.
- High school students participating in joint enrollment programs accounted for over 27 percent of total community college enrollment. About half the participants were high school seniors; about one-third were juniors.
- Joint enrollment programs account for about 15 percent of total credit hours.
- Among high school students, over 85 percent participated in joint enrollment courses delivered through a contractual agreement between a community college and school district.
- PSEO courses accounted for almost 8.2 percent of total joint enrollment.
- Over 50 percent of participants in joint enrollment programs were male, a slightly higher percentage than the general population of community college students.
- Over 17 percent of participants in joint enrollment programs had a minority racial or ethnic background, slightly higher than the general population of community college students.
- The most common subject areas in which students jointly enrolled include social science and history, English, mathematics, science, and healthcare.

### About this Report:

This report summarizes joint enrollment in Iowa's community colleges. Jointly enrolled students are high school students enrolled in community college credit coursework. This report contains fiscal year data for the state's 15 community colleges reported through the Community College Management Information System (MIS) and confirmed by each college.

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## Joint Enrollment

Each year, tens of thousands of Iowa high school students enroll in community college credit coursework. The Department of Education refers to these students as “jointly enrolled.”

Nationally, public two-year colleges offer college credit coursework to high school students at higher rates than other sectors of higher education (Kleiner and Lewis, 2005). In 2005, 98 percent of public two-year colleges nationwide had high school students jointly enrolled in college credit coursework compared with 77 percent of public four-year institutions. In Iowa, delivery of programming to high school students is a part of the community colleges’ mission (Iowa Code 260C.1) and, consequently, all 15 community colleges are committed to offering college credit opportunities to these students.

Joint enrollment of high school students accounts for more than a quarter of total community college credit enrollment and approximately 15 percent of total credit hours. Iowa is one of 47 states with statewide dual enrollment policies (Education Commission of the States, 2013). In Iowa, high school students enroll in community college credit courses in a variety of ways including through Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) courses, college courses offered

through a contract between a local school district and a community college, and enrollment in a college course independently as a tuition-paying student.

While sometimes still referred to as “dual credit,” joint enrollment does not necessarily entail credit being issued at both the secondary and postsecondary levels. Some programs, such as PSEO and concurrent enrollment, require that credit be issued at each level, while other joint enrollment opportunities have no such requirement.

Figure 1 – Joint Enrollment (Headcount) by College: 2009-2013

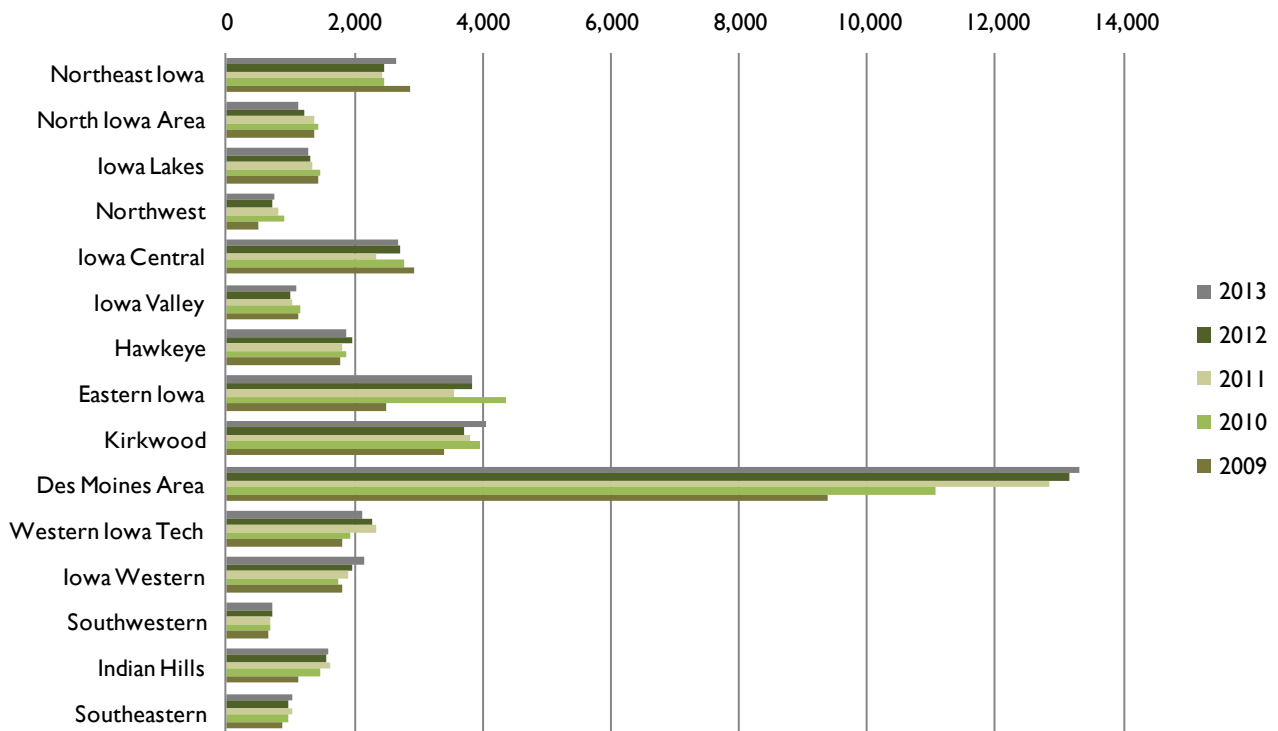

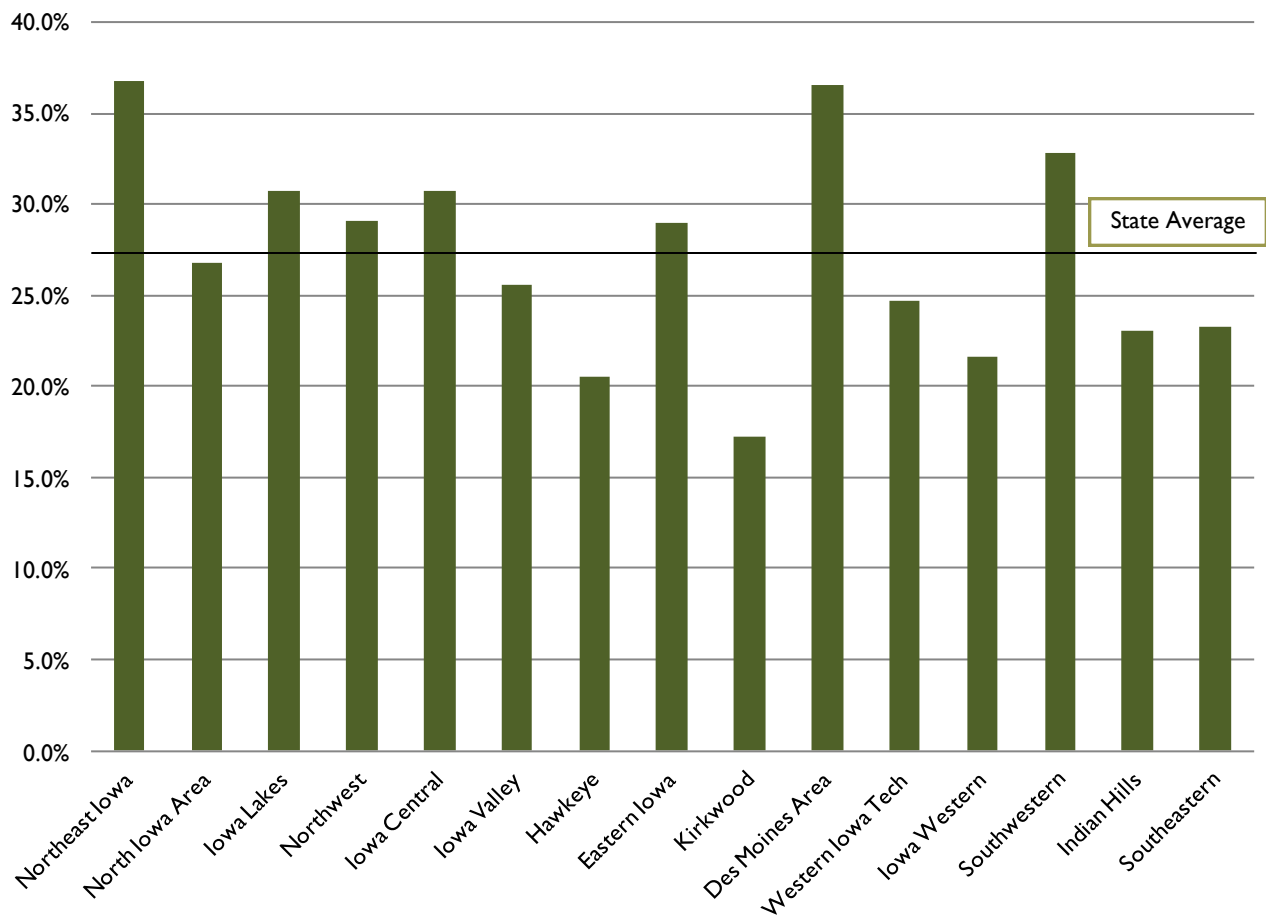
Most joint enrollment opportunities fall under the purview of Senior Year Plus. This legislation, passed in 2008, consolidated and standardized several existing programs involving college credit opportunities for high school students including PSEO, concurrent enrollment (which entails supplementary weighting for local school districts), career and regional academies, Advanced Placement®, and Project Lead the Way®. The Community College MIS captures joint enrollment in three categories — PSEO, contracted courses (which may or may not be concurrent enrollment and generate supplementary weighting for the partnering local district), and tuition.

Joint enrollment in Iowa community colleges has risen to a record high of 40,262 unduplicated students in fiscal year 2013 (Figure 1, Table 1). In fiscal year 2013, jointly enrolled students accounted for 27.69 percent of total enrollment

(Figure 2). Since fiscal year 2008 – the year Senior Year Plus legislation was enacted – joint enrollment has increased 28.02 percent. Enrollment growth of jointly enrolled students increased 1.7 percent from 2012 to 2013 (table 1), which coincides with a 2.2 percent increase in jointly enrolled credit enrollment. Enrollment increased at 10 community colleges and declined at five.

The number of credit hours taken by each jointly enrolled student remained unchanged from the previous two years, with each jointly enrolled student enrolling in an average of 7.7 credit hours (Figure 4). The number of credit hours taken per jointly enrolled student has increased 0.3 credit hour since fiscal year 2008. Because high school students generally enroll part-time, they account for a smaller percentage of total credit hours than total enrollment (Figure 3). In fiscal year 2013, joint enrollment accounted for 14.9

**Figure 2 – Joint Enrollment as a Percentage of All Students by College: 2013**

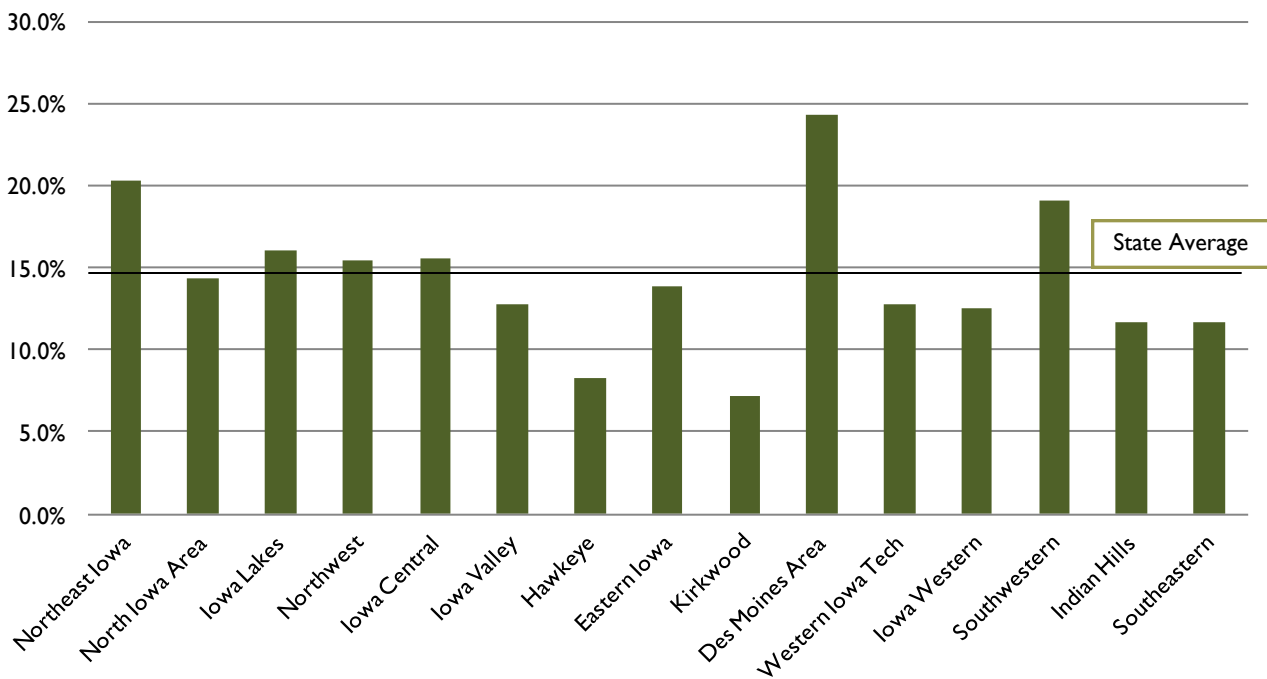

percent of total credit hours. The rate at which high school students enroll in community college coursework varies by local school district and community college region (Figure 10).

**Joint Enrollment Offering Arrangements**

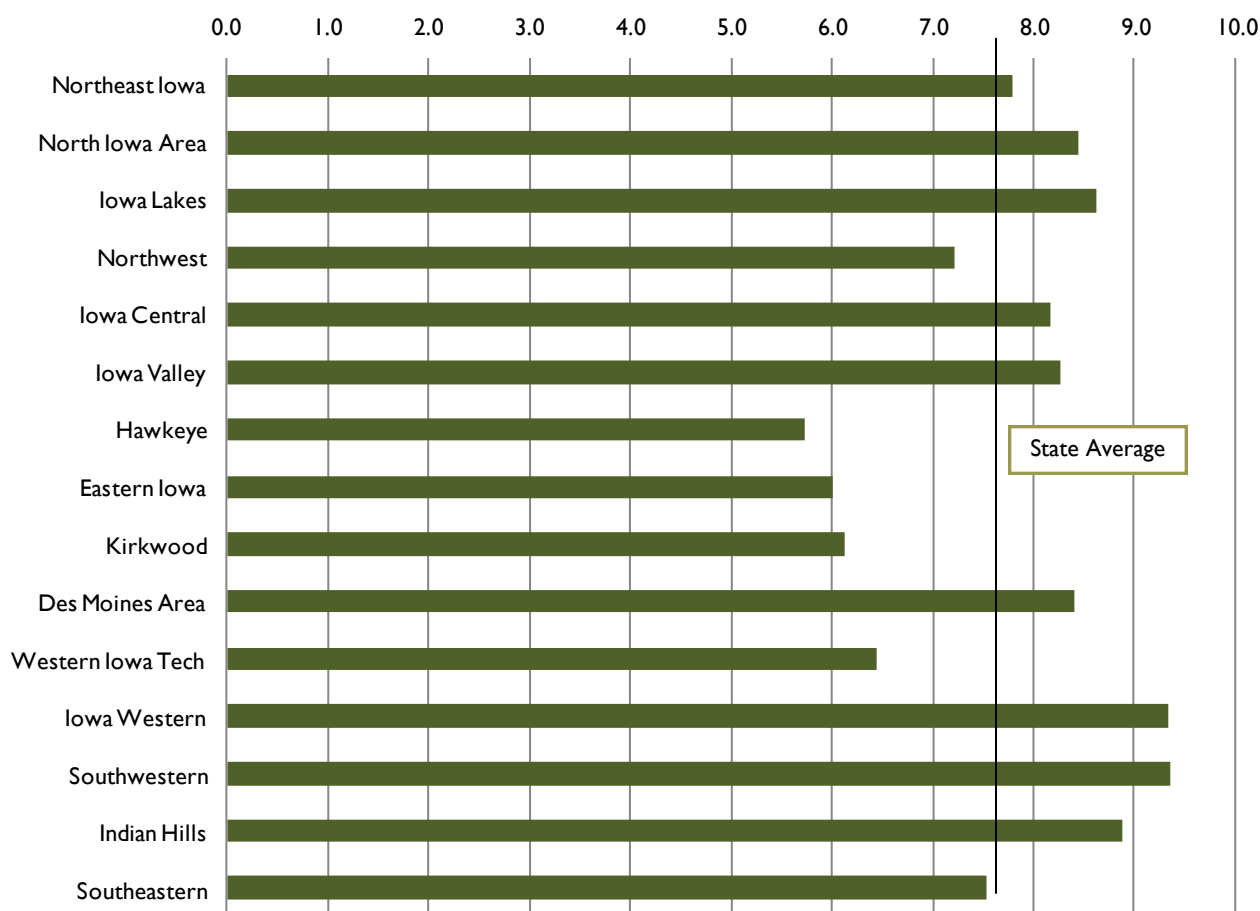


Figure 5 – Joint Enrollment by Offering Arrangement: 2013

Contracted courses had the largest enrollment of the three types of joint enrollment offering arrangements accounting for 85.9 percent of jointly enrolled students in fiscal year 2013 (Figure 5, Table 4). Enrollment in contracted courses rose 2.2 percent from the previous year to 36,796 students. PSEO, which accounts for 8.2 percent of joint enrollment, fell 16.4 percent from fiscal year 2012. Enrollment of tuition-paying students increased 30.7 percent from the previous year.

**Joint Enrollment Student Demographics**

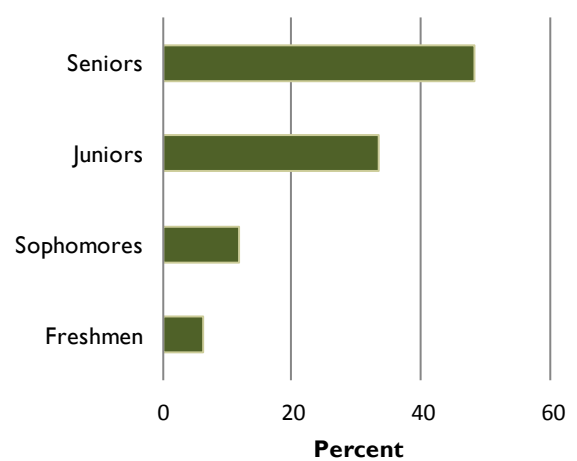


**Figure 7 – Jointly Enrolled Student Racial and Ethnic Background: 2013**

The typical jointly enrolled community college student is male, a high school senior, and Caucasian. In fiscal year 2013,

approximately 50.7 percent of joint enrollees were male compared with 45 percent of the overall student body (Figure 6). In fiscal year 2013, approximately 12.5 percent of joint enrollees reported having a minority racial or ethnic background. Tuition course enrollment had the largest proportion of minority students (14.7 percent) followed by contracted (12.7 percent) and PSEO (5.8 percent). Hispanics were the largest minority group with 44.7 percent of minority joint enrollment followed by Black and Asian students with 19.0 percent and 17.7 percent respectively (Figure 7). In fiscal year 2013, by comparison, 17.6 percent of all community college students reported having a minority racial or ethnic background, 39.6 percent of whom were Black and 31.1 percent of whom were Hispanic.

As expected, jointly enrolled students were younger than the overall community college student body, but very few were younger than age 17 (about 21.8 percent). More than 72.5 percent of jointly enrolled students were age 17 or 18.

**Figure 4 – Credit Hours Per Student by College: 2013**

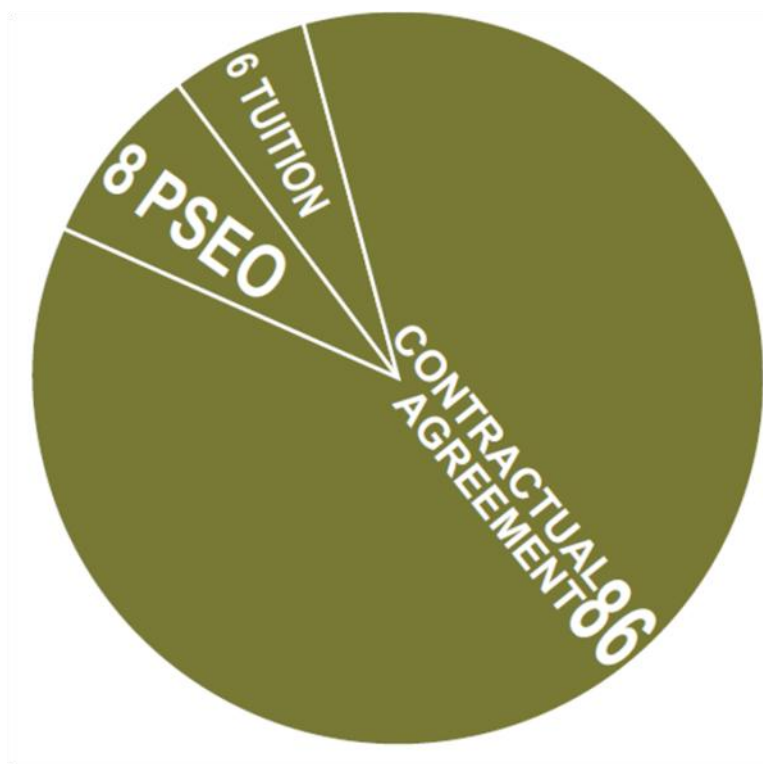
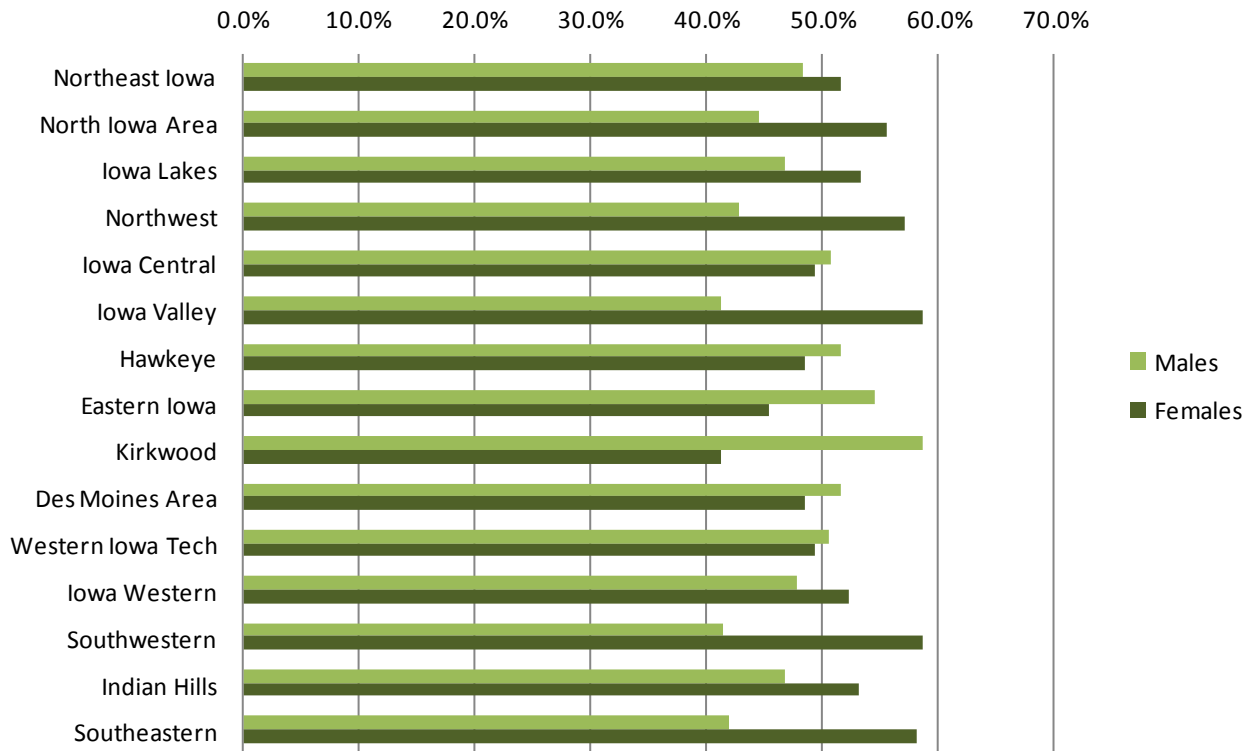


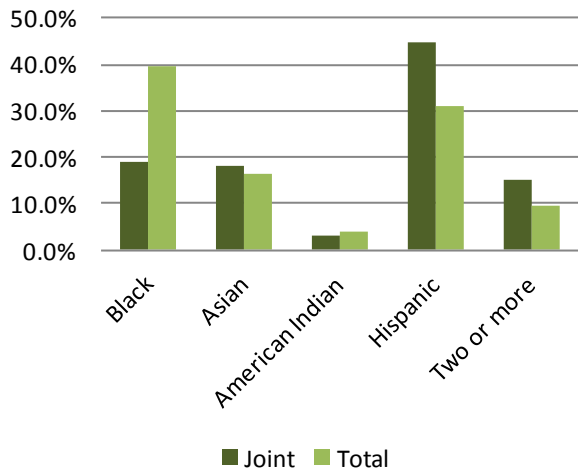

**Figure 6 – Jointly Enrolled Student Gender by College: 2013**

Jointly enrolled students were almost exclusively residents of Iowa. In fiscal year 2013, 99.6 percent of jointly enrolled students were from Iowa.

**Grade Level of Joint Enrollment Students**

Jointly enrolled students tend to be high school upper class students; in particular, seniors. Eighty-one percent of jointly enrolled students were in their last two years of high school (Figure 8). Approximately 12 percent of jointly enrolled students were sophomores in high school and 6 percent were freshmen. In total, 27.5 percent of public school

students in grades 9-12 enrolled in a community college credit course including more than half of all seniors. Data on grade level is derived through a match between the state's K-12 data repository and the Community College MIS. Figure 8 displays the distribution of high school students enrolled in Iowa community colleges during fiscal year 2013.

**Concurrent Enrollment and PSEO by Subject Area**

Unlike other sections of this report, which utilize Community College MIS data, this section is based on Student Reporting in Iowa data submitted by Iowa public

school districts. The department analyzed data on the instances of concurrent enrollment and PSEO courses taken by subject area. Courses taken by tuition-paying students enrolling independent of the district were not included.

Of PSEO courses taken, 41 percent were in the subject area of social sciences and history (Table 5). English language and literature courses accounted for an additional 14.9 percent of courses taken. Of concurrent enrollment courses taken, the subject area with the greatest instances of courses taken was English language and literature (21.9 percent), followed by social sciences and history (13.7 percent), and mathematics courses (9 percent).

Table 6 presents the instances of community college career and technical education (CTE) and arts and sciences courses taken by Iowa high school students through contractual agreements in fiscal year 2013. Of courses taken through contractual agreements, 40.3 percent were classified as CTE, 59.7 percent arts and science (Table 6).

#### **Revenue from Concurrent Enrollment and PSEO**

Concurrent enrollment offerings are one of several sharing opportunities incentivized by state policy. School districts may be eligible for additional funding in the form of extra

weighting in the school foundation funding formula for participation in certain programs including concurrent enrollment. For concurrent enrollment, weighted funding provides districts with funding to pay community colleges for delivery of concurrent enrollment courses provided certain requirements are met.

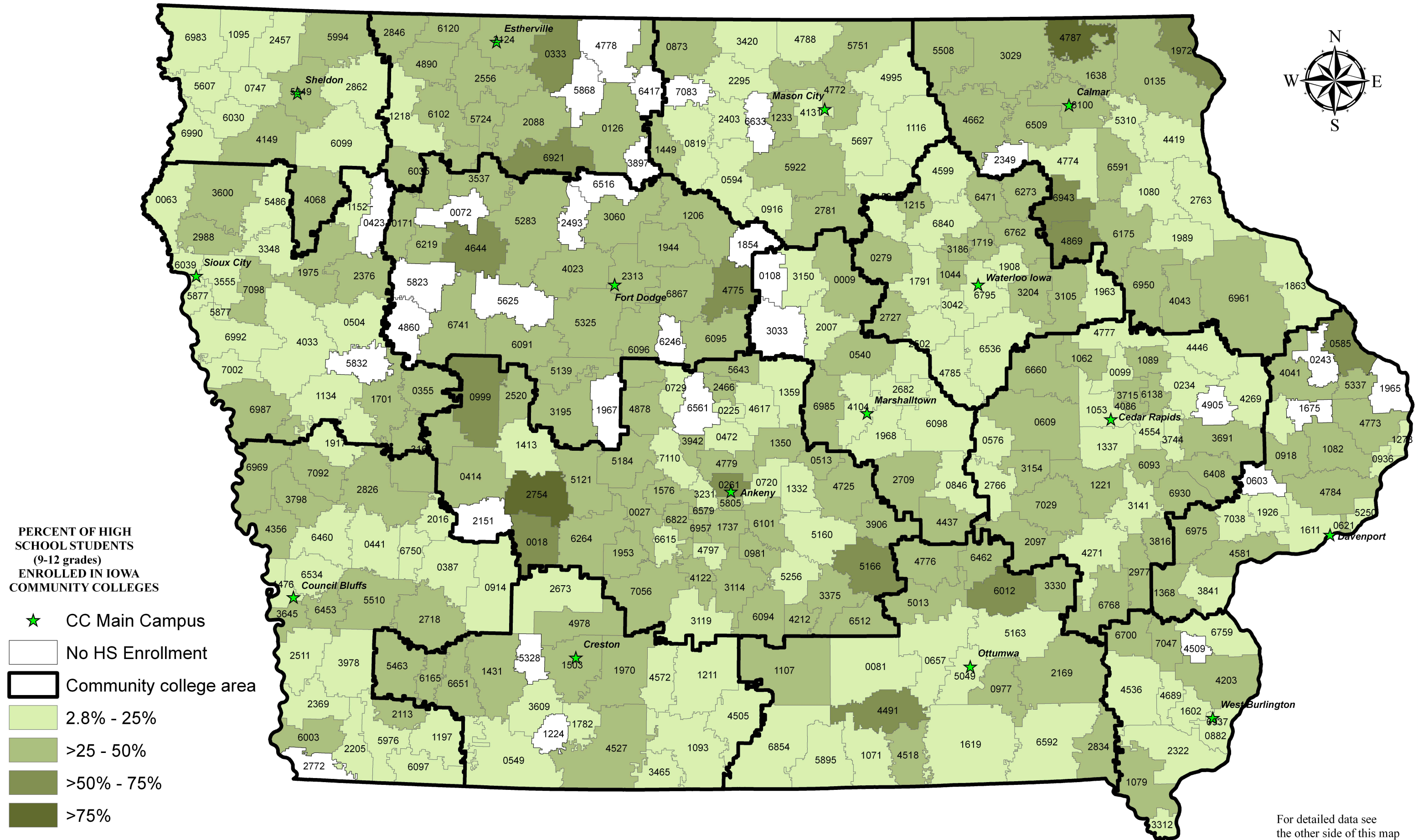
In fiscal year 2013, community colleges generated approximately \$17.7 million in revenue from concurrent enrollment courses. In total, 385 high schools (duplicated) enrolled 36,796 students (unduplicated) in a concurrent enrollment course (Table 7).

Students may have an opportunity to enroll in college courses through PSEO provided the school district does not offer a comparable course (including concurrent enrollment offerings). The school district pays the eligible postsecondary institution the cost of the course or \$250, whichever is lower.

In fiscal year 2013, community colleges generated more than \$2.1 million in revenue from PSEO enrollment. Over the past year, 280 high schools (duplicated) sent 3,500 students (unduplicated) to a community college for postsecondary coursework (Table 8) through PSEO.

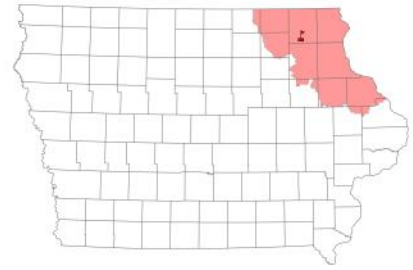

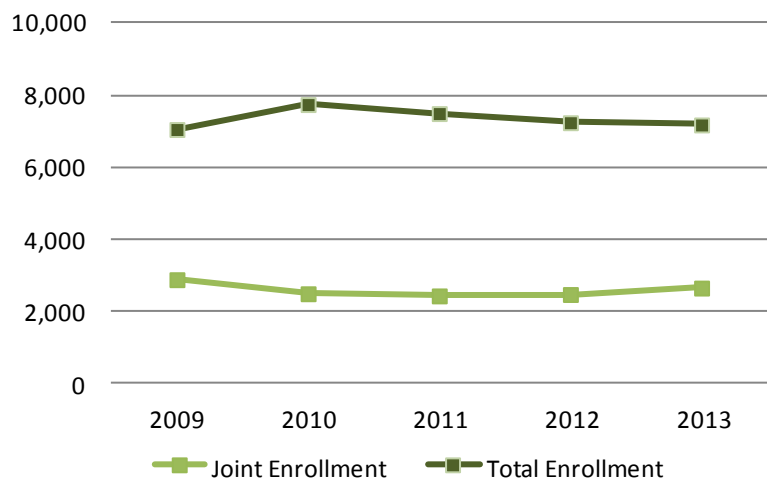

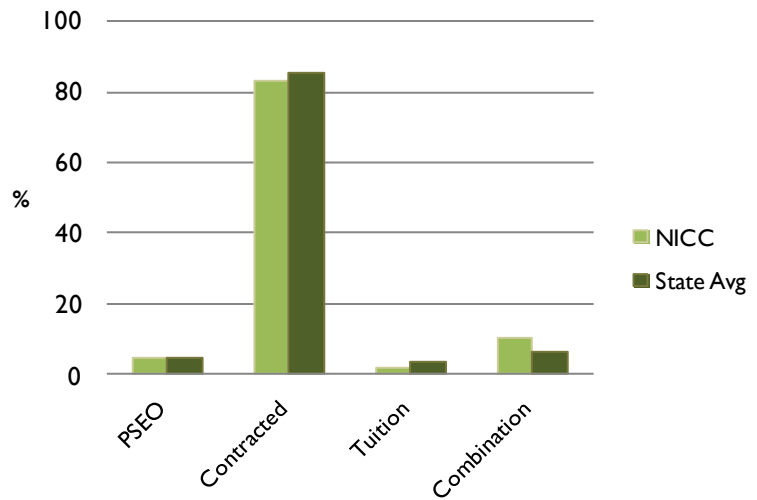

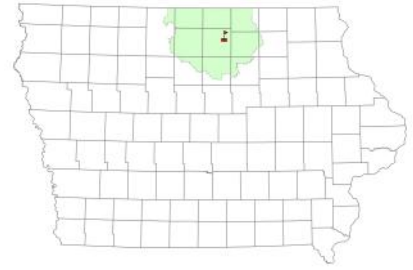

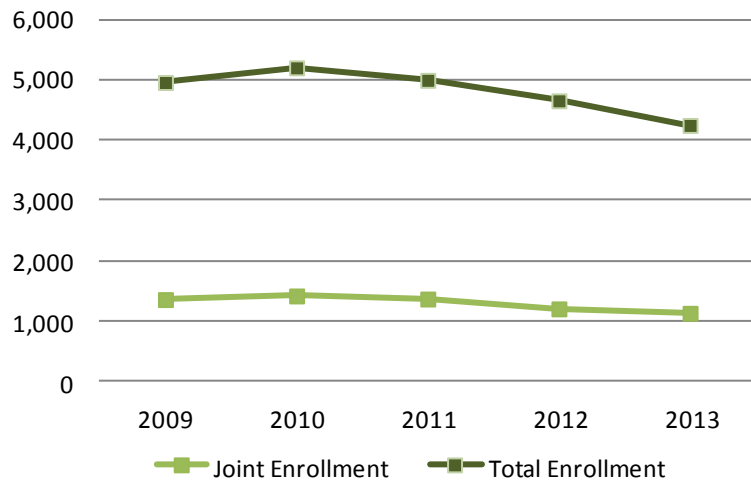

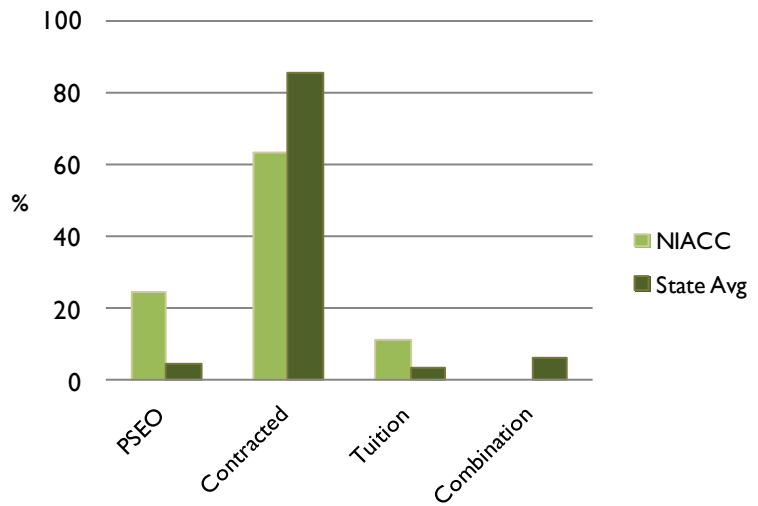

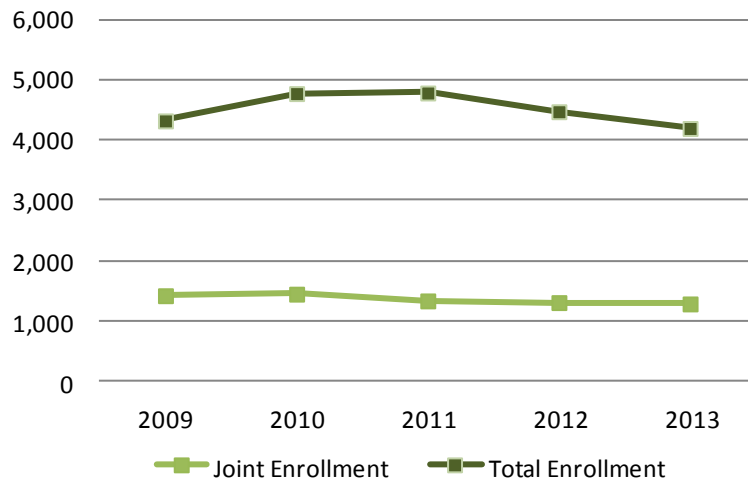

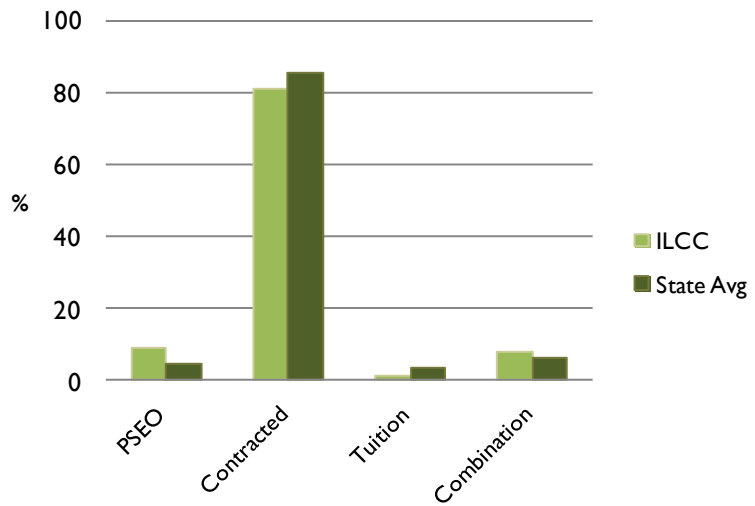

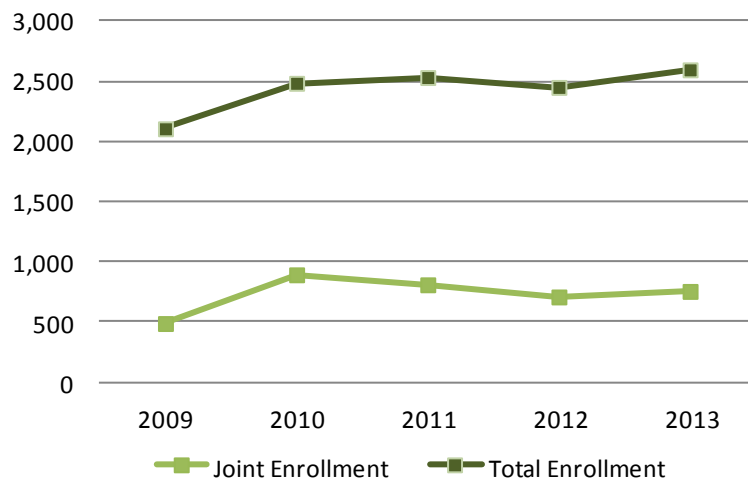

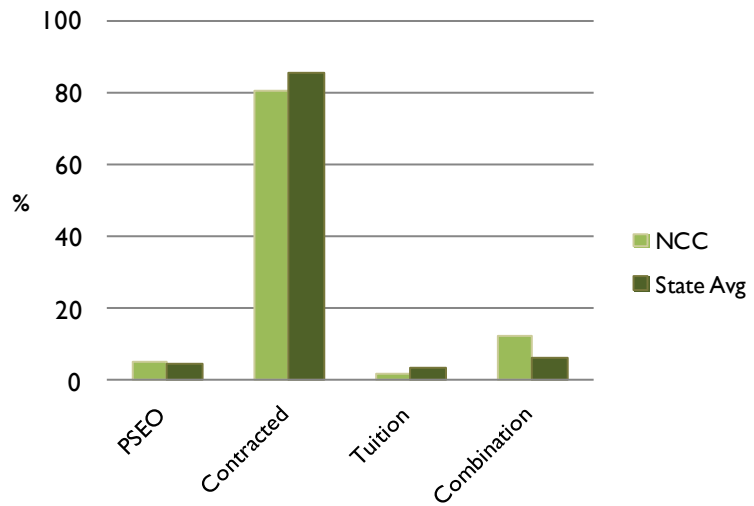

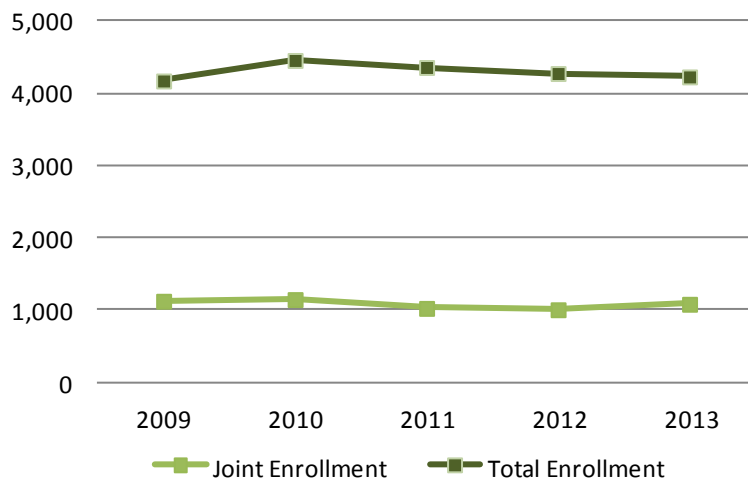

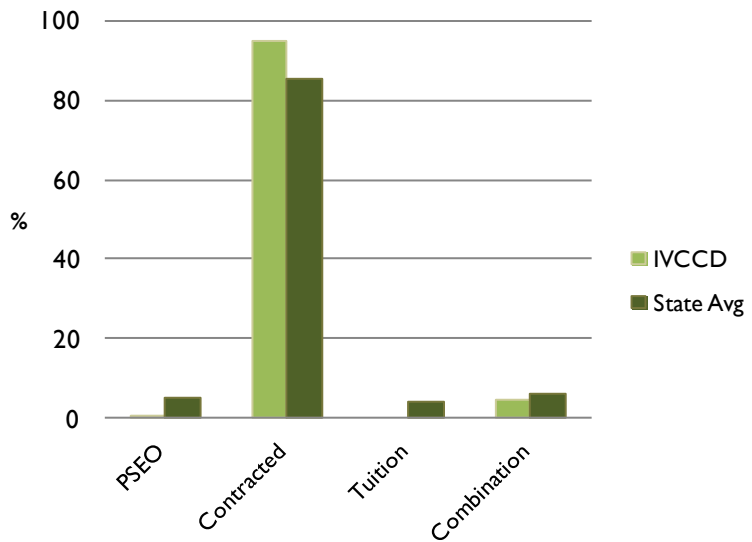

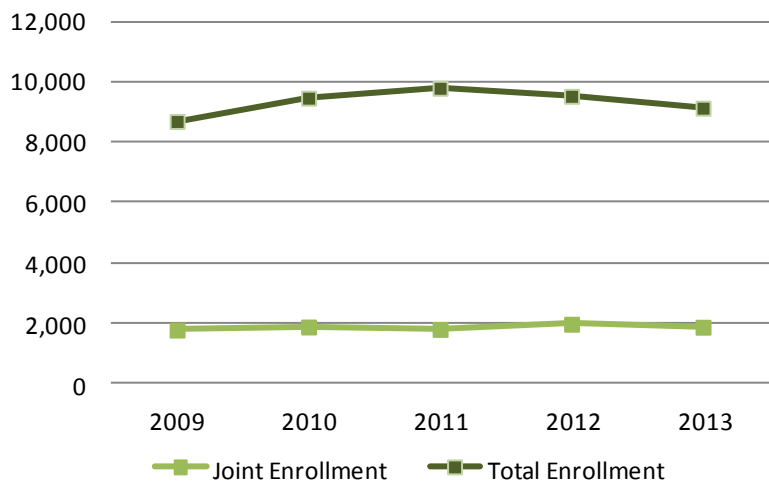

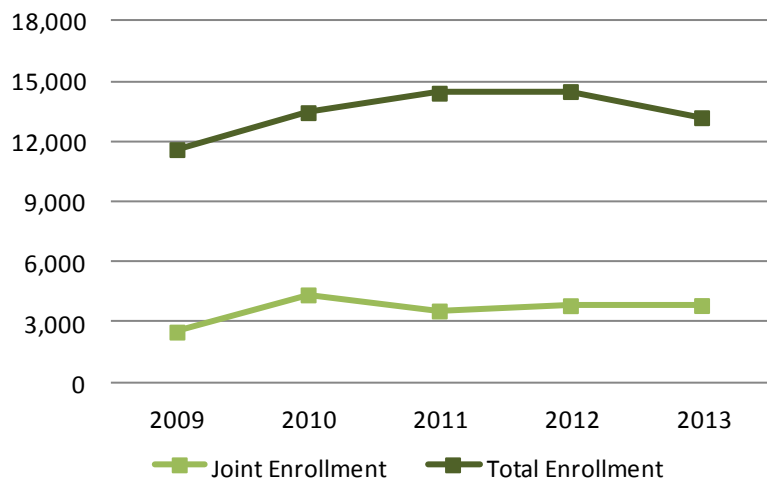

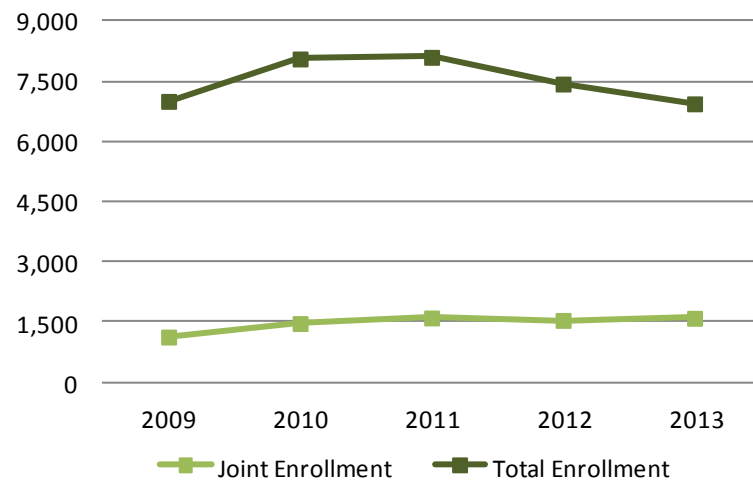
## Indian Hills Community College (IHCC)

During fiscal year 2013, joint enrollment at Indian Hills Community College (IHCC) totaled 1,598, or 23.0 percent of total enrollment. Of jointly enrolled students, approximately 3.1 percent were enrolled through PSEO, 93.5 percent were in contracted courses, and 1.2 percent were taking courses independently as tuition-paying students. The percentage of total enrollment that were also enrolled in high school increased an average of 9.3 percent annually over the last five years, compared to the state average annual growth of 2.4 percent during the same period. During fiscal year 2013, the number of jointly enrolled students at IHCC increased 10.8 percent from last year.

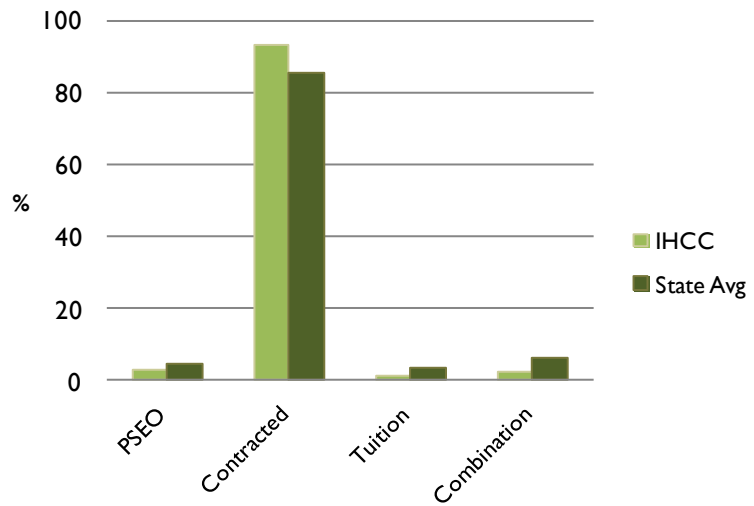

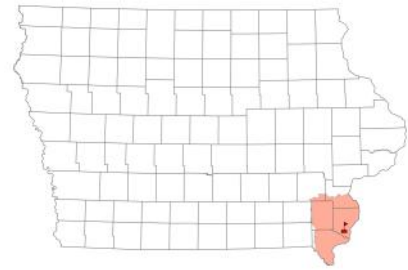

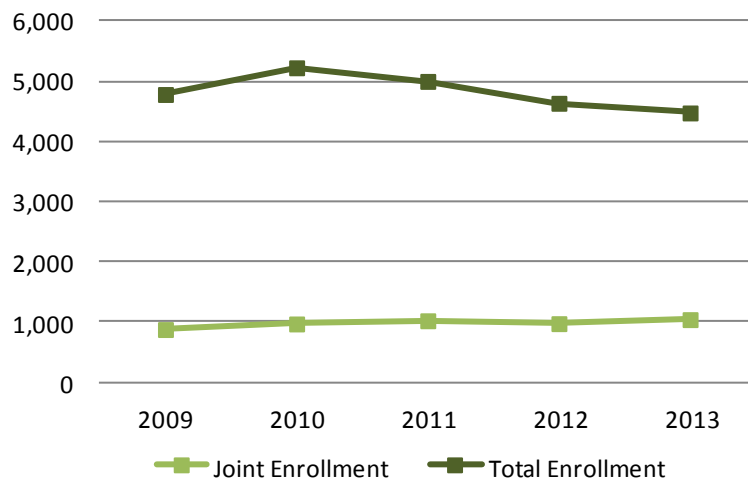
## Southeastern Community College (SCC)

During fiscal year 2013, joint enrollment at Southeastern Community College (SCC) totaled 976, or 21.0 percent of total enrollment. 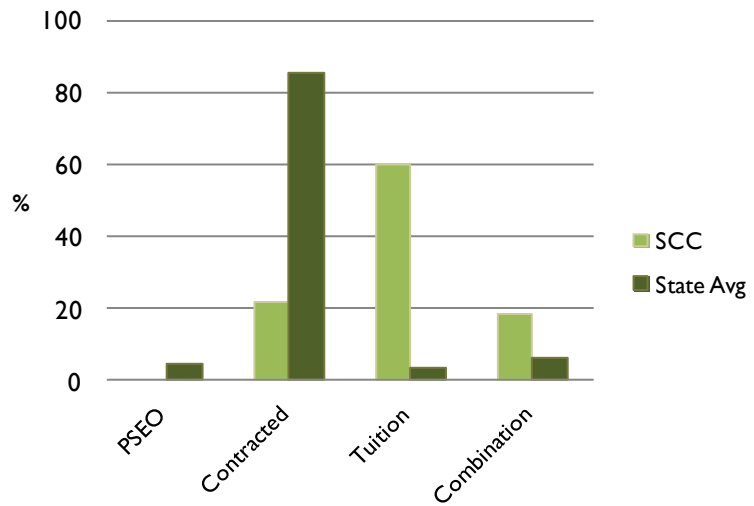
