Perkins V Middle School Requirements Minimum Standards for Middle Grades Career and Technical Education (CTE)

Recipients that meet the following minimum standards will be allowed to expend federal funds received under Perkins V to plan, develop, and deliver quality middle school career exploration and development programming that is rooted in meaningful student activities and experiences. Recipients intending to use federal funds received under Perkins V shall meet the following minimum standards for middle grades career and technical education: (Review and add a checkmark next to each standard to verify that the standard is in place).

 \Box Taught by a qualified CTE instructor meeting licensure, endorsement, or authorization

requirements established by the Iowa Board of Educational Examiners.

 \Box Provide all students with awareness and exposure to the 16 Career Clusters® by way of one or more of the following:

□ Career and Technical Education courses like Agriculture; Business; Family and Consumer Sciences; Health Science; Industrial Technology; Information Solutions, which align with the six Iowa recognized CTE Service Areas; or

 \Box Offer a career pathways-based course or courses⁵.

□At a minimum, offer a course or courses to both seventh and eighth grade students, and may include a course or courses at the fifth and/or sixth grade levels.

□ Courses must meet a minimum of 6 weeks (30 days).

Use state approved <u>middle school CTE and 21st Century Skills standards</u> to ensure students gain a full range of desired technical, academic and employability knowledge and skills

□ Help develop a student's occupational identity, employability skills, 21st Century Skills, and

technical skills by providing hands-on, experiential learning.

□ Incorporate learning into each student's Individual Career and Academic Plan as defined by Iowa Code chapter 279, section 61.

□ Provide exploratory work-based learning experiences such as classroom speakers, industry tours, career fairs, projects or hand-on experiences.

□Align to a variety of career development activities, including but not limited to career and academic counseling, high school programming, postsecondary alignment.

 \Box These activities should be part of the District's Career and Academic Planning Plan.

Check the boxes below to certify that the school district is eligible for CTE middle school funding.  \Box The business office and/or Perkins contact will affirm either the use of locally developed middle school CTE standards or the Iowa high school CTE standards under the assurances required in the claim submission process.
