Instructions

This Career Cluster Plan of Study can serve as a guide, along with other career planning materials, as learners continue on a career path. Courses listed within this plan are only recommended coursework and should be individualized to meet each learner's educational and career goals.

NOTE: This Plan of Study, used for learners at a secondary school, should be customized with course titles and appropriate high school graduation requirements as well as college entrance requirements. Use * to identify courses that are taught for Concurrent Enrollment Credit through a postsecondary institution.

Instructors

High school graduation requirements should also be considered. See examples for each service area on subsequent tabs in the excel file. Identify which post-secondary program aligns to your service area and Program of Study and align course selections to facilitate a smooth transition.

For example:

- In the CTSO box, select the appropriate CTSO that aligns to your service area (Possible multiple CTSOs depending on the service area).
- Placement Assessments select the assessments that would best serve students Accuplacer, ACT, SAT, ASVAB, ALEKS, and others.
- School-Based what experiences could benefit a student's experience and career preparation.
- Community Based what experiences could benefit a student's experience and career preparation.
- Assessments and Certification placeholder for certifications that could be earned through CTE coursework at the secondary level
