

Iowa's Exchange Visiting Teachers Program Financial Disclosure

Introduction

This document discloses financial information regarding most teaching positions and provides general information about living in lowa. Iowa school districts and accredited nonpublic schools employ exchange visiting teachers (EVT) in accordance with state regulations and policies and pay them according to their experience, certification level, and local salary scale.

Per federal guidelines §62.24(g)(1), EVT candidates are to be provided with a summary of possible costs that could be incurred during the exchange visiting teacher experience. This disclosure document seeks to provide the EVT with an understanding of 1) the relative cost of living in Iowa and 2) costs associated with the J-1 visiting teacher program.

Consideration of costs when deciding whether to pursue this temporary employment opportunity.

Program Fee

Public school districts and nonpublic schools pay a program fee of \$895. The fee covers some of the cost of the teaching license, background check, orientation week (hotel accommodations and meals, conference room, trainers, speakers, and materials), and international FedEx costs of official documents for visa.

Teacher Salaries in Iowa

Teacher salaries are determined by local school districts and nonpublic schools based on several factors:

- Cumulative years of full-time service as the teacher of record in K-12 classrooms
- Level of educational attainment (in recognized post-secondary institutions)
- Local salary scale

General information

- Starting salary for public schools: \$33,500
- Starting salary for nonpublic schools: \$27,300

During the 2021-2022 school year:

- The average public school teacher entry-level salary for all lowa teachers was \$40,261/year
- The average public school teacher salary ranged from \$45,000 to \$65,000
- The average nonpublic school teacher salary for all lowa teachers was \$40,000

The approximate range of visiting teacher salaries was \$40,000 to \$60,000.

Estimated Arrival Costs

Purchase a reliable, used car (car loan will be about \$250- \$400/month)	\$2000-\$7000*

Deductions: Taxes

Federal Income Tax Rates (Social Security, Medicare, and Federal Withholding Taxes)

First time J-1 visa holders are exempt from Social Security and Medicare taxes for the first two calendar years of their program.

Insurance Costs

J-1 Visiting Teachers (and their J-2 dependents) are required to maintain adequate insurance for the duration of their time in the United States. Failure to do so risks immediate removal from the program.

Benefits

In lowa, most school districts and accredited nonpublic schools manage health insurance benefits for their teachers, offering several choices in the coverage levels and cost. Here are the benefits that exchange teachers are eligible for:

Health Insurance Benefits

Each plan offers coverage for many similar services, may include:

- Emergency Room Care
- Hospital Services
- Prescription Drug Coverage
- Physician Office Visits
- Routine Physicals
- Outpatient Mental Health Care

Dental Plan

In addition to medical coverage, exchange teachers may also have access to a dental plan. Covered dental services may include:

- Routine Check Ups
- Restorative Services
- Non-Surgical and Surgical Treatments
- Bridges and Braces
- Orthodontia

Minimum Required Insurance Coverage

Many districts and accredited nonpublic schools assist with medical health insurance. Teachers must supply their own repatriation and evacuation insurance.

Minimum required coverage*	Estimated cost
Approximately medical health insurance of approximately \$100,000 per accident or illness	\$150-\$500/month (single-family)
Repatriation of remains in the amount of \$25,000	Combined packages of \$40-\$120/year (single-family)
Medical evacuation in the amount of \$50,000	Combined packages of \$40-\$120/year (single-family)

^{*}All exchange visiting teachers must submit documentation of coverage on an annual basis.

Related Question: Can my spouse legally work in the US on a J-2 visa?

Work opportunities for spouses vary depending on the area in which teachers are placed. Spouses under the J-2 visa planning to seek employment must submit work authorization applications and required application fees to the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services. These applications cannot be submitted until J-2 dependents have entered the U.S. and the approval process may take as long as 90 days. If approved, J-2 dependents can then apply for their Social Security cards and consider employment in the U.S.
