

## 2024-2025 Open Enrollment Billing Chart & Scenarios

Updated December 2024

Tuition due from the resident district to the serving district for students served pursuant to open enrollment includes the budget year state cost per pupil of state aid and the following supplements: teacher leadership and compensation (TLC), professional development (PD), and early intervention childhood (EIC). If the student was included in the resident district's October 2024 English Learner (EL) supplementary weighting calculation, funds due to the resident district for this purpose are also billable.

• **Billing:** Tuition is billed and paid on a semester basis (on or before February 15 and July 15) (lowa Code § 282.20(3)). Tuition is prorated for students that attend less than a full year.

- Supplementary Weighting: Eligible Concurrent Enrollment (CE) and Project Lead the Way (PLTW) Courses For CE supplementary weighting calculations:
  - The receiving district will use the fall and spring Student Reporting in Iowa (SRI) application data to generate their billings. The list of CE and PLTW courses eligible for inclusion in the generation of supplementary weighting is available under <a href="Course Coding and Supplementary Weighting">Course Coding and Supplementary Weighting</a> on the Department's <a href="SRI">SRI</a> web page.</a>
  - The resident district will use the CE and non-fall supplementary weighting applications to verify the amounts being billed.

## Tuition Adjustments:

- <u>Termination or Suspension of Open Enrollment</u> Under special circumstances that terminate or suspend open enrollment status, a district must prorate tuition for payment on a per diem basis.
- Attendance Less Than a Full Year Partial years should be based on a per diem rate (\$43.48), prorated for days served under open enrollment.
- Competent Private Instruction (CPI) For students who are under CPI for dual enrollment and are open enrolled in the district's Home School Assistance Program, combine the appropriate rows in the billing chart below.
- <u>Transportation</u> The resident district may deduct transportation expenses incurred from the amount of tuition it sends to the receiving district. However, for a student with an IEP, the cost of transportation is not deducted from the special education tuition.

## **Billing Scenarios**

Open enrollment applications filed after March 1 of the preceding school year must qualify for good cause or shall be subject to the approval of the board of the resident district and the board of the receiving district. Below are common open enrollment scenarios with the identified fiscal responsibilities.

Full year open enrollment	Student is a resident of District A and parent/guardian files for open enrollment to attend District B on or before March 1 (grades 1-12) or September 1 (for kindergarten or preschool student with an IEP). At the start of the year, the student starts attending District B and remains at District B.	If the student starts and remains at District B, District B bills District A for open enrollment tuition and applicable supplements.
Partial year open enrollment	Student is a resident of District A. The student starts school in District A, but open enrolls to District B during the school	District B will bill District A at a per diem rate for open enrollment costs, prorated for the days the student is served under open enrollment.

Partial year open enrollment	Student is a resident of District A. The student moves to District B, but open enrolls to District C during the school year. The student moves to District B and continues to be served in District A under open enrollment. Continuation in previous resident district - Move is after certified enrollment count date	Student is a resident of District A. District B will bill District C at a <i>per diem</i> rate for the remainder of the year.	
Continues open enrollment agreement during move - Move is after certified enrollment count date	Student is a resident of District A, but attends District B under open enrollment. Student moves to District C and continues to attend District B under the existing open enrollment agreement.	Since the move is <i>after</i> October 1, District B will bill District A for open enrollment costs for the remainder of the year. District C will become responsible at the beginning of the next school year.	
Continuation but moves to serving district	Student is a resident of District A, but attends District B under open enrollment. Family moves to District B and the student continues to be served in District B as a resident student thus terminating the open enrollment agreement.	District B will bill District A at a per diem rate for open enrollment costs for the number of days the student is served under open enrollment. No billing will occur after the move date.	
Alternate receiving school district - Multi-year open enrollment	Student is a resident of District A, but has been attending District B for more than one year under open enrollment. After the start of the next school year, the student	District B will bill District A at a per diem rate for the number of days the student is served under open enrollment in District B.

Senior under open enrollment graduates – Completes senior year calendar	Student is a resident of District A and is open enrolled to District B. Student enrolled at the start of the school year and graduates on the date reflected in the school calendar for all seniors.	District B will bill District A for the full year open enrollment tuition costs.	
Senior under open enrollment graduates midyear	Student is a resident of District A and is open enrolled to District B. Student enrolled at the start of the school year and graduates at the end of first semester.	District B will bill District A at a <i>per diem</i> rate for open enrollment costs, prorated for the days the student is served under open enrollment.	
Whole grade sharing (WGS)	Student is a resident of District A and is open enrolled to District B. District B whole grade shares to District C for the student's grade level.	Open enrollment status transfers from District B to District C. Resident district pays District C open enrollment tuition (not WGS tuition).	
Special education, partial year	Student is a resident of District A and is open enrolled to District B. After the open enrollment agreement commences, the student is staffed into special education.	Open enrollment continues. District B bills District A for open enrollment tuition at a per diem rate for the number of days served as a regular education student and then bills actual costs for the days the student is served as a special education student.	
Out of state move in – Move is after certified enrollment count date	Student moves into District A from out of state and open enrolls to District B.	District B will bill District A at a <i>per diem</i> rate for open enrollment costs, prorated for the days the student is served under open enrollment.	
PMIC, juvenile detention center, substance abuse treatment or other similar placement  Student is a resident of District A and is open enrolled to District B. During the open enrollment, the student is placed in a juvenile detention center, mental health or substance abuse treatment facility, or other similar placement.		District B will bill District A at a <i>per diem</i> rate for the number of days the student was served in District B. The open enrollment status and billing are suspended upon placement in the facility. The open enrollment agreement will automatically be reinstated when the student is released from the facility.
