- 3 administer medication, supplements, or other substances for five years. Mr. Hemann
- 4 has completed all requirements and requests. Mr. Hemann made a reinstatement
- 5 request at a previous meeting and the board denied his request. At this meeting, the
- 6 board was provided a letter from Mr. Hemann. Board members were split on the
- 7 decision. Some felt that the additional letter didn't state what he did and that he
- 8 wasn't remorseful for his actions. He didn't indicate what he learned or mention the
- 9 danger to the student involved. Others stated that he did complete the necessary
- requirements of the settlement agreement. Kristen Rickey moved, with a second by

- Joanne Tubbs, Nicole Proesch and Executive Director Cavin (Cavin) met with
- 29 Representative Wheeler regarding license renewal credit offerings from other agencies
- 30 as well as the ethics violation process.

- We have had some requests from a couple of legislators who would like to continue the
- 2 discussion of board actions. Cavin will inform the board when this meeting takes
- 3 place.

5 Still uncertain regarding the 2023 legislative agenda at this time.

- 7 Agency Update:
- 8 Board Secretary Kim Cunningham will be retiring at the end of this year. Cavin is
- 9 working with DAS as far as posting the position, interviewing, etc.

- We are continuing to see an increase in the number of requests to fill vacant positions
- with a substitute. Currently, we received 301 requests which is up from 275 last
- month. The majority of the requests have been approved.

- We have spent the last several months working on our website. It had to be updated
- to a new platform. The new website will be rolled out in November. This will not be
- the last revision as we will need to make modifications once the State has adopted a
- new universal image. The updates we have done should be easily transferred over to
- 19 the new image.

- 21 <u>Licensure Update</u>:
- 22 September was the second highest September with the number of licenses issued in
- 23 the last 10 years (3,840).

27 Conditionals are being done within 24-48 hours.

29 Districts are working on the BEDS report which is due to the DE on November 4.
