By the Numbers

Three regent universities and 26 private colleges and universities serve lowa by offering programs leading to licensure.

Institutions also offer a variety of endorsements (45 options) in addition to secondary, middle school, and elementary education programs.

One private institution, lowa Wesleyan University, closed which drop the secondary and elementary program numbers by one.

Educator Quality Team Initiatives

Educator Quality Team Initiatives

Quality Standards

Cohort Meetings

Scheduled gatherings for EPPs in self-evaluation and readiness. Advisors tackle program issues, provide resources, and enhance self-study methods. Cohort programs exchange resources for process improvement.

Site Visit Resources

Expanded resources for continuous quality review and improvement. Upgraded handbooks, templates, and tools for program self-study and site visits.

Feedback

Formal and informal feedback collected from EPPs, state panel team, and site visit team. Aimed at improving process and resources for program quality and review.

Red Tape Review

Summer 2023 review and revision of administrative rules for clarity and efficiency. Collaboration with general counsel to streamline rules.

Program Support

Dyslexia Resources

Collaborative workshops and additional resources for EPP members. Increased collaboration between educator quality and K-12 teams on early literacy.

Data-Driven Prof. Dev.

Consultants use various data sets to determine professional development topics. Data sources include state and national initiatives, teacher surveys, annual reports, site visit feedback, and consultant reflections.

Office Hours

Regular open office hours for rule, code, program review, and quality questions. Opportunity for resource sharing among preparation programs.

Mentor/Mentee Support

Experienced chairs and deans mentor those new to their roles. Peer support complements consultative support available to program members.

Education

New Chairs Workshop

Expanded workshop supporting new chairs, program coordinators, assessment directors, and deans. Collaboration with Board of Educational Examiners (BoEE).

Paraeducator Prep. Grants

Multiple rounds of grants awarded to boost the teacher preparation pipeline.

Professional Conferences

Engagement in national and state conferences for creative solutions in educator preparation. Participation in meetings such as NASDTEC, PESBA, AACTE, and others, addressing national and state challenges.

Analysis of Rules

Responding to stakeholder requests, the team analyzes and proposes ideas for student teaching flexibility and paid paraeducator opportunities.
